~~**A-5, APPROVE Gallery Space Lease for District Art Collaborative Project**
As part of a district collaborative art project, the Visual and Performing Arts Department will lease Gallery One at the M Street Arts Complex for seven months in the 2016/17 school year for student art displays. Plans for this space also include instruction in visual arts and curating from teachers and guest artists. Students at various grades from early learning through high school at seven schools in the district are participating in this collaborative art project. The Superintendent recommends approval. Requests for Qualifications (RFQ) 17-04 and 17-05 are to provide a pool of qualified firms/consultants for use in support of the district's new construction, modernization, portable relocation, and deferred and general maintenance projects. Included in the Board binders, and recommended for approval based on an extensive review, is a list of qualified firms/consultants to provide the following services on a project by project basis: architectural/engineering, civil engineering, electrical engineering, mechanical engineering, structural engineering, landscape architectural/engineering, school facility planning/land acquisition/disposition and relocation, environmental site assessment and/or geotechnical, construction inspection, material testing and construction inspection laboratory, and hazardous materials and indoor air quality consulting. A-8, APPROVE 4-year Agreement for Sports Science Institute with California State University, Fresno

Included in the Board binders is a contract approval form for the Sports Science Institute, an enrichment opportunity for Fresno Unified Health Pathway students organized in collaboration with California State University, Fresno's Health and Human Services-Kinesiology Department. Fresno Unified High School Health Pathway students will participate in the Sports Science Institute, as part of Fresno Unified's California Career Pathways Trust Grant goals. Students will learn about and get hand-on experiences within the fields of Exercise Science, Athletic Training, Sports Psychology and Team Building (through physical education.) In addition to hands-on experiences, students will get exposed to specific career fields within the Health Science and Medical Technology industry sector as well as specific understanding of career and educational post-secondary options within the field of Kinesiology. All experiences will take place on the Fresno State Campus. The Superintendent recommends approval. Fiscal impact: \$20,000 per year for four (4) years, paid for by the California Career Pathways Trust Grant. Contact person: Bob Nelson, telephone 457-3657.

B-13, PRESENT and DISCUSS in the matter of the Charter Renewal Petition for University High School

University High School (UHS) has delivered a renewal petition to the district seeking authorization to operate July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2022. UHS is currently serving approximately 480 students in grades 9-12. The school is located at 2611 E. Matoian, on the California State University, Fresno campus. The Superintendent recommends a decision. Fiscal impact: The estimated fiscal impact for the 2017/18 school year is approximately \$4 million. Contact person: Kim Mecum, telephone 457-3731.

C. RECEIVE INFORMATION & REPORTS

C-14, RECEIVE Results of Sale of General Obligation Bonds: Measure Q, Election of 2010, Series F, and Measure Q Refunding Bonds, Series A and Series B

Included in the Board binders is a financial summary describing results of the recent issuances of the approximately \$30 million in Measure Q, Series F, and \$120 million in Measure Q refunding bonds, Series A and Series B sold on September 14, 2016. Prior to the sale, the district received a strong credit rating of 'Aa3' from Moody's Investor Service listing the district's large tax base, stable financial position and strong management team as credit strengths of the district. The Measure Q, Series F bond proceeds were received on October 12, 2016, the same day that the refundings also closed. Fiscal impact: The final debt service for Measure Q, Series F represented a decrease of \$7.2 million in debt payments over figures last shared with the Board of Education, while the Measure Q refunding bonds, Series A and Series B represented a \$16.6 million increase in savings over figures last shared with the Board of Education.
