TITLE AND SUBJECT: Present and Discuss an Overview of the Fresno Unified Literacy Initiative

ITEM DESCRIPTION: Staff will present an overview of the district's new literacy initiative which will include the establishment of a literacy task force and campaign. In August 2023, Fresno Unified will launch a literacy initiative with an emphasis on reading on grade level by the end of first grade. Staff will share background, literacy practices, and key events leading to the launch. Educational partners are an essential component of the task force and will include community members, teachers, leaders, parents, and instructional assistants who will create an actionable plan in the following focus areas:

- 1. Preschool through Second Grade Classroom Instruction
- 2. High Quality Supports Beyond the Classroom
- 3. Family and Community Partnerships

The cross-departmental literacy planning team is utilizing the California Comprehensive State Literacy Plan as a guidance document for best practice in the field of literacy. In accordance with research by the California Department of Education, the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing and leading researchers in this area, concerted efforts will be made to promote the following:

- 1. A comprehensive literacy program that builds oral and written language. This includes components of listening, speaking, reading, and writing.
- 2. Adequate instructional time spent in the early years on foundational literacy skills that includeprint concepts, phonological awareness, letter-sound knowledge, phonics, decoding, and fluency.
- 3. Integrated and Designated English Language Development for students identified as English Language Learners.
- 4. Informed instruction based on assessment embedded within a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) Framework for all learners including students with disabilities.










The progression across our earliest grades

State Literacy Data

- 58% of California students read below grade level in 3rd grade
- Among low-income students of color, over 75% read below grade level
- Only 1 California school district has over 50% of low-income Latinx students at grade level and none that have over 50% for low-income African American students
- Fresno Unified is currently ranked 148 out of 285 districts



- 1. Read over fifty research articles, district plans, state guidance documents, and books on literacy to build the team's shared knowledge.
- 2. Attended two literacy sessions by Dr. Timothy Shanahan, previous president of the International Literacy Association and member of the Advisory Board of the National Institute for Literacy under Presidents George W. Bush and Barack Obama.
- 3. Attended the first annual Reading League Summit titled English Learners and Emergent Bilingual Students.
- 4. Attended three hours of weekly planning time with follow up homework that includes additional research and creating planning documents
