MINUTES - BOARD OF EDUCATION WORKSHOP

Fresno, California March 28, 2023

Fresno Unified School District, 2309 Tulare Street, Fresno, CA 93722.

At a Workshop of the Board of Education of Fresno Unified School District, held on March 28, 2023, there were present Board Members Cazares, Jonasson Rosas, Levine, Wittrup, Student Member Aquino, and Board President Islas. Superintendent Dr. Nelson was also present. Board Members Davis and Thomas were absent.

Board President Islas CONVENED the Board Workshop at 5:04 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Armand Chavez led the Flag Salute.

BOARD WORKSHOP AGENDA ITEM

PRESENT and DISCUSS Overview of Districtwide Safety

Staff presented an overview of districtwide safety including the safety plan, information related to multi-tiered safety supports, and current Safety Office deployment, roles, and responsibilities. Additionally, staff provided information related to Campus Safety Assistant training, stakeholder input and emergency response data and highlighted the proposed redesign.

Superintendent Dr. Nelson expressed appreciation for everyone attending. Commented it has been a while since there has been a board workshop on the topic of safety. Commented, all seven of our Trustees have safety at the forefront of their concerns. Everyone of our kids and every one of our faculty members, everybody affiliated with a school, our families that come have a right to a safe learning environment.

Very thankful for the people present and viewing via live stream. We have teachers present who work with kids with a high degree of need, we have leaders present, thankful to have parents in the room who are very concerned about how we can do this and do it better. As these issues continue to occur, across our nation and across the world, us being as forth right as we can. It is hard because to some degree you are competing against the free agency of people who are designed to

do things that are not good for kids, but we remain vigilant. Thank you to my principals that are online watching, same thing to our teachers and leaders. Paraprofessionals play a major role, our parents, families and kids, there is nobody that safety is not a priority, and it takes people in every walk of life and every jurisdiction to make it better.

There are not universal beliefs about safety. We acknowledge we are going to tread in some sacred areas around safety, some folks are supportive of policing in schools and other folks feel differently, some folks feel very strongly about suspension, expulsion, and referral to law enforcement and others feel differently, the bottom line is we want to make sure to provide an environment where kids are safe to the greatest degree we can.

For the record, Deputy Superintendent Her thanked people for attending, completed introductions of those presenting, and provided condensed outcomes for the presentation as follows:

- Provide information around multi-tiered layers of safety support
 - Social emotional learning, school climate and culture, and physical safety
- Communicate roles and responsibilities
- Share stakeholder input and emergency response data
- Share 2023/24 priorities

After the presentation, Board members had an opportunity to provide comments or ask questions. A summary is as follows:

Member Jonasson Rosas: Requested clarity as to who updates key words for the Gaggle program to monitor. Suggested it would be good to be proactive and if there are avenues provided to inform the process, the district might consider using principals and teachers as a source to update key words.

Requested clarity as to active assailant training and if school sites receive training. Shared parents have asked, in an age-appropriate way, if the training could be part of lockdown procedures.

Requested clarity as to whether all traffic accidents are reported. Commented the Fresno Police Department and City use their data sites to determine deployment of resources. Member Jonasson Rosas encouraged people to call the police when there are traffic accidents around schools.

Requested clarity as to if crisis calls were duplicative. Requested clarity as to missing and runaway students, are numbers listed in crisis calls from the district only or are parent calls included.

Requested clarity as to whether all principals responded to the survey pertaining to the top three safety concerns. Commented this is important subject matter and it is concerning if not all principals responded.

Commented on proposed safety investments and asked if the district has considered implementing safety buttons, like what is used at Fresno State and Fresno City College.

Commented cameras are after the fact, campus safety assistants (CSAs), having extra bodies, I am sure we will talk about roles and duties and I do not want to make it sound as if all campus safety assistants are doing this, but I often have people telling me CSAs are just in the golf cart on their phone and I know that is not an accurate picture of all CSAs but the impression is out there, and as long as there are key expectations and those expectations are met I think they can provide additional things, but the same with vaping sensors, again, it is after the fact, and we are looking from a punishment perspective. Innovative and active solutions are worth exploring.

CSAs receive training on NARCAN, but do they have it with them? Are CSAs trained in lifesaving measures? If a campus safety assistance saw someone in an emergency situation, could the CSA decline to provide lifesaving aid? Requested to see that incorporated into their job duties. I know there are classifications such as with police officers, firefighters, and certain medical providers where that is required and would hate to have a situation where because it was not required, lifesaving measures were not provided. It needs to be someone's responsibility because when it is everyone's it is no one's. I am open to suggestions; suggest CSAs because they are trained, just want to make sure we are never in a situation where aid is not administered in a timely manner. Asked if training could happen jointly to improve communication. I think there is value in joint training to build relationships.

Member Levine: Requested clarity as to what encompassed 170 calls to the Fresno Police Department (Fresno PD) and asked if the 170 calls are not listed in other categories. Asked for an example of a call to Fresno PD that would not fall under another category on the list of crisis calls. Commented it would be helpful if additional categories were added such as custody or parent disputes.

Requested clarity as to what fell under the topic of traffic brought forward by the student taskforce, was it accidents or amount of traffic? Requested name of the proposed fifteen sites chosen for Safe Routes to school and rationale for choice. Asked why the district is not doing all schools, asked if it was due to budget constraints. Shared the United States Department of Justice may have funding to help.

Commented on concerns shared regarding consistency of CSAs and asked if CSAs at the site are supervised by a vice principal. Asked if other structures have

been considered pertaining to oversight of CSAs. Asked what the total cost to the district would be if CSAs were added to all sites. Expressed appreciation that the proposal recommends adding CSAs to elementary schools.

Clerk Wittrup: Thanked Board members Jonasson Rosas and Levine for their comments. Expressed agreement with everything they said. Thanked Deputy Superintendent Her, Amy Idsvoog, and Armand Chavez for presenting. Commented it is a lot of impressive data. Commented the crisis call numbers may be double, as staff may not always turn in crisis forms.

Asked if the NARCAN is easily accessible at every school. Commented has heard it is locked up and requested staff look into accessibility, wants to make sure the district is doing its very best to make NARCAN accessible.

Impressed with information at the district level about safety but feels there is a disconnect between what is intended with investments in safety and what happens at school sites in real time. How does the district assess and evaluate every school site's safety practices? Does the district monitor safety practices, give feedback, look at incidents handled poorly, conduct an autopsy of the incident to look at why it happened and how practices can be changed to have a better response the next time an incident happens? How do we assess what we intend with investment, what we buy, and how it plays out at the schools? Does not believe a debrief always takes place. Where are the weaknesses we know of and how do we improve in those areas; there is truly a disconnect between what the district intends and what plays out at schools. How does the district address things happening at schools that should not be happening? Commented it is easy to not do a crisis debrief, to get through the crisis and be done, but when there is no debrief there are missed opportunities for learning and improvement.

Shared concern regarding variations from one school site to the next around safety. Commented usually the site leadership sets the tone, it is felt when you go on campus, a sense of leadership, of running a tight ship, people paying attention, urgency around safety; and then you go to other campuses and do not feel that way at all. Requested to see more consistency and urgency through the system when addressing concerns site leaders, teachers and parents bring to attention. Asked staff what they would say are the district's weaknesses. Commented the district needs to work on behavior interventions.

Member Cazares: Requested clarity on required training or certifications for the campus safety assistant position. Is there a two-year experience requirement? Should consider training current parents or past parents that know the campus layout, grow your own, a current parent might be biased but maybe someone who has a graduate from the school or the principal knows well, as we know it is difficult to ramp up quickly, especially with the elementary schools on our radar soon.

Vice principals that oversee campus safety assistants want to do a good job, they

want to be good mentors, they want to be good supervisors, but they probably have the same amount of responsibilities as any other vice principal. We need to look at, especially this year and the coming year, where are the needs for additional campus safety assistants and additional interventions and what additional needs our children may have; so vice principals overseeing campus safety assistants can provide the support needed and focus more time with the campus safety assistants.

Asked if the Gaggle program monitors other languages than English. Asked if the Raptor system has launched at all school sites? Do all school sites have one point of entry? Commented campus safety assistant team is well intentioned and many have good relationships with site and students, but we have talked about safety assistants being on their cell phones for months now, and they are still using their cell phones. Why do they have cell phones at work? If they are on sight walkie talkies should take the place of the cell phone.

Asked if crisis call data was available for the COVID year? Requested to see crisis call data for 2020/21. The main call Member Cazares receives from parents is when their child was attacked verbally or physically and they do not feel the offending student is being held accountable. How do we do a better job of communicating with parents?

Asked for the number of students and campus safety assistants that responded to the safety survey. Requested more detail on data provided on slide twenty-one. Asked staff to look at not only routes outside but also entry points. Asked for clarity as to the responsibilities of the Regional Safety Specialist.

Student Member Aquino: Expressed the importance of the presence of senior staff and trustees at the sites they represent. Encouraged board members to visit sites more often. Requested clarity as to proposed gear for campus safety assistants. Requested clarity as to lockdown notification systems for DHH students and staff.

Board President Islas: Safety is multi-faceted and we have covered how we are helping to address social emotional and behavior issues, and physical health of students and even social health with Gaggle. We need to also consider what have been some of our biggest pain points, racism for an example, and the weaponization of racism is something we need to consider as part of how we address safety. There are elements of important factors we have not drilled down enough, we need to consider how to address and approach and try to prevent stress and issues that perpetuate people's feelings of insecurity. Nurses are definitely part of our safety team, designer facilities, transportation is a huge part of how we promote safety. I heard tonight we are conscious enough that we need NARCAN, but we have not made any investments into the treatment or recovery of students struggling with substance abuse which is a huge area of need. We talked about the Raptor system to help keep people out during the day but we are

not considering the threat when the unhoused are on the campus in the evenings and weekends and the turmoil that is caused by their presence and how we might better respond to those situations. I think we spend a lot of time talking about monitoring our students' behaviors when we talk about safety and I think it is important and I think there are real threats. We witness and discuss suspensions and expulsions before each board meeting and there are issues that do need to be addressed. There are other categories of people causing insecurities on our campuses such as staff and teachers and yet we are not categorizing or monitoring those threats in a way that also gives us data about how we need to intervene to prevent some of that from happening. We have issues of sexual assault of students, we have issues of inappropriate behavior, use of our facilities, and those are things about which I think we need to have honest conversations. How we dissuade and prevent those types of things from happening. Hostile environments, again going back to racism, all of our staff play a very important role in students being welcomed, our parents being welcomed, creating calm and bolstering peace, these are all things in which we need to be proactive. How we work collectively, some of our management have talked about the Disneyland model and all the things Disneyland does to make you happy as you get to the gate and on to the campus. The psychology of some of those interventions we need to better understand and figure out how we can apply.

Most of our students interacting with SROs are students with disabilities and I do not see any training for SROs on how to engage appropriately with students with disabilities or professional learning reflected in the proposal. How are we helping to teach self-regulation, how are we helping to diffuse situations with more professional learning. How many interactions do our general population have with SROs? There seems to be inequity with students of color and I am concerned if you couple students of color and disabilities we continue to see a trend of profiling and expulsion of disadvantaged students. I want to make sure we are interacting in ways we are mitigating, that is not driven by racism, we are trying to make investments that allow all of our students to be successful, that we are not creating these pipelines into prison or disadvantage for our students. Are we ensuring training of campus safety assistants? Are we monitoring to be sure all of our CSAs are going through training? If asked, would leadership be able to produce when CSAs went to training, are we capturing anything about acquisition of skills as result of the training, knowledge increases, if these trainings are in fact having the result we expect in how our CSAs are working. How is lack of performance being documented for intervention, if we are doing the training apparently the training is not being utilized. Or we are doing the training and applying these investments but nobody is monitoring them so there is no incentive to comply.

Commented on increased number of student incidents with a car. Assessments are important and I see them as a long-term effort, we are gathering information, we are identifying areas of intervention, we are working with our counter parts, but an assessment is not necessarily an intervention. I want to act on the data and not wait on an assessment about the missing assets on or around our campuses

when advocating for infrastructure. I know we at least have one contractor, Safe2School and they are serving elementary campuses, but we have evidence this year our middle and high school students need support. So, in the past we have talked about internship opportunities for older students acting as crossing guards, paid positions. We explored before and maybe we need to revisit that it becomes a noon-time assistant position so we can have all campuses covered with some support. I think that we need to invest more in this area and we can't rely on the long-term outcome of advocating for infrastructure because it will not mitigate the current issues we are experiencing. Asked to see a proposal to support internship opportunities for students.

Referenced slide #15, and asked, of the 24 arrests how many of those were referred to youth court, are they all felonies, misdemeanors, what is happening to our students and how do we make sure they are put back on a right track, they are given opportunities to come back from mistakes they made. Interested in learning if there were more resources for our nursing staff and what it would look like. Lockdowns, asked to see differentiation of lockdowns. Deaths include students and staff, not necessarily on campus. Slide #25, new CSA at elementary and no mention of more CSA resources at middle school. Slide #26, is there a reason we can not get the SROs to help monitor traffic. We need to be driving our contracts for the district. Would like to see it added as a duty into the contract with the Fresno Police Department. Crossing guards need more support and gear, asked to see that included in the proposal. Classroom management and school leadership, restorative justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion would like to see those added as well.

Special education, we need to have a very honest conversation with our parents, regarding SRO interactions. We need partnerships with parents to help us support our students.

OPPORTUNITY for Public Comment on Agenda Item

For the record, the Board received five (5) requests to address the Board on this item. The individual's name along with a summary of topic is as follows:

- 1. Vicki Allen Westburg: Referred to safety incidents that took place while employed with Fresno Unified. Commended staff on presentation but commented did not hear talk of teachers. Ms. Allen Westburg works at Fresno Pacific University with new teachers and as part of the course new teachers are asked questions pertaining to their knowledge of safety plans at school sites such as: layout of classroom, if they are equipped with appropriate tools for windows and doors, barricading procedures and locations. Requested the district to set up a notification system. Teachers need to know what to expect and what they are expected to implement immediately. Concern is not a matter of if but when we have a shooter in the Valley.
- 2. Dan Westburg: Asked if the district has the ability to deal with a school shooting. How will a school lock down? Is there a sweep procedure to check

- bathrooms, hallways, and other exposed areas? Asked if students knew what people expect of them in a lockdown? Are the expectations the same across the district or are there different protocols for different sites? Substitute teachers that go from site to site, do they know the specific protocols for lockdowns or intruder on campus?
- 3. Eileen Cheng Buron: Not satisfied with the data provided, it is not really what is going on at the school site. You are not doing our job, hearing the parents, parking, and unloading zone safety issues. We are always asking you to hear our voices. Referred to an incident at Greenburg.
- 4. Benita Vasquez: Commented security is what is most important to us right now. Asked when the district show families a plan of security because this is worrisome? Agreed with one point of entry and exit at school sites for safety. Commented security people should be well-trained. Requested the district to include parents as they have ideas to share. Thank you for involving us because this is something we all worry about.
- 5. Delia Delgado: Commented heart is aching for families in Nashville. Asked what protocol is followed when a student is physically abused by a staff member, an incident happened and Ms. Delgado was not happy with how it was addressed. Commented safety throughout the school has been important for years, oldest son does not use the restroom because there is a lot of substance abuse taking place in the restrooms.

Member Cazares: Requested staff comment on school safety plans.

Board President Islas: Requested clarity as to if there is a districtwide safety plan.

Member Levine: Is there a designated place in the office to find the safety plan?

Deputy Superintendent Her, Executive Officer Amy Idsvoog, Manager Vanessa Ramirez, Manager Armand Chavez, and Superintendent Dr. Nelson were available to provide clarity.

OPPORTUNITY FOR UNSCHEDULED ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

12. <u>Termination of Agreement</u>. Either District or Contractor may terminate this Agreement at any time for any reason upon thirty (30) days prior written notice. In the event of early termination, Contractor shall be paid for satisfactory work

performed to the date of termination. The District may then proceed with the work in any manner the District deems proper.

Notwithstanding the expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason (a) any provision of this Agreement that imposes or contemplates continuing obligations on a Party shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including without limitation, the rights and duties under Paragraphs 12, 13, 15, and 17; and (b) all undisputed fees due and payable hereunder through the termination date in accordance with Paragraphs 4 and 5.

13. Confidential Information

- a. For the purposes of this Agreement "Confidential Information" includes any written or oral information or data, disclosed by either Party to the other, which may include, without limitation, information relating to technical, financial, personnel, personal employee information, the network, corporate, administration, plan design, benefits or contractual affairs of either Party or a third party that has been identified as confidential or that by the nature of the circumstances surrounding disclosure ought reasonably to be treated as confidential.
- b. Contractor hereby agrees that it shall not disclose Confidential Information, and any materials, discussions, or other communications concerning Confidential Information to any person or entity, except to its own employees, contractor personnel, and to its attorneys, accountants, consultants and other professional advisors having a "need to know," and who are themselves bound by similar nondisclosure restrictions (collectively, "Representatives"). If Contractor becomes aware of any disclosure or use not in compliance with this Agreement, Contractor shall notify the District in writing within three (3) business days. Contractor shall use at least the same degree of care in safeguarding Confidential Information as it uses in safeguarding its own confidential information. Representatives shall be bound to comply with all terms of this Paragraph
 - 13.B. Upon the request of the District, Contractor shall provide a written acknowledgment from each of its Representatives that said Representative is bound by the terms of this Paragraph 13.B.
- Contractor's obligation under this Agreement to not disclose Confidential Information shall not apply to information that: (a) becomes generally available to the public other than as the result of unauthorized disclosure by Contractor or a third party; (b) is independently developed by Contractor without the aid, application or use of Confidential Information; or (c) was received by Contractor on a non-confidential basis prior to receipt from the District or from a third-party lawfully possessing and lawfully entitled to disclose such information.
- d Disclosure of Confidential Information shall not be precluded if such disclosure is: (a) required pursuant to a valid court order; or (b) in the opinion of legal counsel for Contractor, is otherwise required by law, provided that in either circumstance:
 - i. Contractor shall furnish the District with a copy of the demand, summons, subpoena or other legal process to compel such disclosure;
 - ii. Contractor shall give the District reasonable prior notice of its intention to disclose Confidential Information in order to allow the District an opportunity to seek appropriate protection; and
 - iii. Contractor shall take all reasonable steps including, without limitation, the pursuit of a protective order, to restrict the disclosure of Confidential Information to the greatest extent possible.
- e. All Confidential Information provided by the District to Contractor is and shall forever remain the sole and exclusive property of the District. By granting access to Confidential Information, the District does not grant any express or implied right to Contractor to use, publish or disclose any Confidential Information. After its review of the Confidential Information Contractor will return to the District all Confidential Information disclosed to it (including copies or summaries of Confidential Information), or with the District's permission destroy the Confidential Information and certify in writing that it has been destroyed.
- 14. <u>Injunctive Relief</u>. Each Party acknowledges that a breach or threatened breach of this Agreement may cause immediate and irreparable harm to the District and that, to protect against such harm, the District may seek from a court of competent jurisdiction the issuance of a restraining order or injunction to prohibit any threatened disclosure

or misuse of the District's Confidential Information. Such an action for a restraining order or injunction is in addition to and does not limit all other remedies provided by law or in equity or by agreement between the Parties.

- 15. Indemnification and Hold Harmless. To the fullest extent allowed by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold District, its agents, employees, Board of Trustees, members of the Board of Trustees, officials, officers, volunteers, and representatives ("Indemnities") free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, negligence (including the active or passive negligence of Indemnities, regardless of whether sole or otherwise, as allowed by law), causes of action, costs, expenses, liabilities, losses, damages or injuries, fines, penalties in law or equity, regardless of whether the allegations are false, fraudulent, or groundless, to property or persons, including wrongful death, (collectively "Loss") to the extent arising out of or incident to: 1) the performance or breach of any of the terms and conditions of the contract (including but not limited to) the Contractor's use of the site; or 2) any acts, omissions, negligence, in connection with the performance of Services or otherwise arising from this Contract ("Indemnification"); or 3) the willful misconduct of the Contractor or their respective agents, subcontractors, employees, material or equipment suppliers, invitees, or licensees. The Contractor's Indemnification includes, but is not limited to, the payment of all damages and attorney's fees, fines, penalties and other related costs and expenses.
 - a The Contractor's defense obligations (with counsel approved by District), shall arise immediately upon tender of any of the Indemnities, and the defense shall be paid at Contractor's own cost, expense and risk, for any and all such aforesaid suits, actions or other legal proceedings of every kind that may be brought or instituted against any of the Indemnities, notwithstanding whether liability is, can be or has yet been established.
 - b. The Contractor shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against any of the Indemnities, in any such suit, action or other legal proceeding. The Contractor shall reimburse Indemnities, and each of them, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided.
 - a Acceptance of insurance certificates and endorsements required under the contract does not relieve the Contractor from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. The requirements of this Section (Indemnification and Hold Harmless) shall apply whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any of such damages or claims for damages.
- 16. Insurance. Without limiting "Contractor" indemnification, it is agreed that "Contractor" shall secure and maintain in force during the term of this Agreement a Commercial General Liability policy (Contractual liability included) utilizing an occurrence policy form, with limits of not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars per occurrence, four million (\$4,000,000) annual aggregate limit. Business automobile Liability Insurance shall be maintained for owned, scheduled, non-owned or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars per occurrence. In the event "Contractor" is working with students individually or providing professional services to students, "Contractor" shall maintain a policy providing coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims. In the event that "Contractor's" Commercial General liability policy excludes coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims shall be required to procure a separate or supplemental policy providing such coverage. The limits of coverage for the abuse and molestation policy shall be not less than \$2,000,000 per claim and \$4,000,000 aggregate. If any of the required policies provide coverage on a claims-made basis then the following shall apply; 1) The retroactive date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work; 2) Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract work; (3) If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a retroactive date prior to the contract effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of work. Self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by District. The District may require "Contractor" to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claims administration and defense expenses within the retention. The policy shall provide, or be endorsed to provide, that the self-insured retention may be satisfied by either the named insured or the District.

The District shall be named as an additional insured on the policies by separate endorsement. A Certificate of Insurance and endorsements shall be attached to the Agreement as proof of insurance. The "Contractor" policy shall provide that it is primary such that insurance maintained by the District, if any, shall be excess and not co-primary. - 17. <u>Independent Contractor Status</u>. While engaged in carrying out the terms and conditions of the contract, the Contractor is an independent contractor, and not an officer, employee, agent, partner, or joint venture of the District.
- 18. Workers' Compensation Insurance. Contractor agrees to provide all necessary workers' compensation insurance for Contractor's employees, if any, at Contractor's own cost and expense.
- 19. Fingerprinting Requirements. District will not withhold FICA (Social Security), state or federal unemployment insurance contributions, state or federal income tax or disability insurance. Contractor is independently responsible for the payment of all applicable taxes.
- 21. <u>Assignment</u>. The Contractor shall not assign or transfer by operation of law or otherwise any or all of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations without the prior written consent of the District.

- Fresno Unified School District will provide pool chemicals, maintenance and repair of pools and pool facilities including custodial personnel and supplies

The agreement provides for administrative extension year to year by the City of Fresno and Fresno Unified School District unless there are material changes in the terms.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF FRESNO AND FRESNO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR USE OF DISTRICT POOLS FOR SUMMER SWIM PROGRAM

This Agreement is made and entered into as of this 11th day of May, 2023, between the City of Fresno, a California municipal corporation (City) and Fresno Unified School District, a public school district (District).

RECITALS

- A. District is authorized by California Education Code Section 10910 to allow for use of District properties for community recreational purposes.
- B. City has an objective of, where feasible, using school sites for community use and to maximize the efficient use, maintenance, and supervision of public facilities.
- C. Expanded community use of District school facilities will maximize utilization of District property and improve opportunities for public and community recreational activity in the City and its various communities.
- D. City and District mutually desire to enter into this Agreement for purposes of expanding access to District's swimming pools, in accordance with the terms granted herein (the Summer Swim Program).

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of the covenants, conditions, and premises hereinafter contained, to be kept and performed by City and District, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Acknowledgement of Recitals and Definitions.</u> All foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference as though fully set forth herein.
- 2. Grant of License. District hereby grants City a no fee license (the License) to use District Pools identified in Exhibit A hereto (Pools) for use in its Summer Swim Program consisting of community recreational swimming, and swim lessons. Sites may be added or modified upon mutual written letter agreement of the parties. The term of the License (the License Term) shall commence on June 12, 2023 and shall continue for a term of one year. At the end of the License Term, upon mutual agreement of the parties, this Agreement may be extended administratively year to year by City and District with an addendum hereto, so long as sufficient appropriations are in place to fund the Summer Swim Program. Either party may terminate the Agreement, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of the Agreement by providing written notice to the other party specifying an effective termination date at

least thirty days from the date of the notice. Provisions of the License are below.

- a. Priority of Use. The priority of use for Pools shall be as follows:
 - 1) District/Civic Center use for aquatics activities and programs
 - 2) City use for Summer Swim Program
- b. Scheduling of Use. Pools identified for community recreational swimming and swim lessons are specified in Exhibit A, attached hereto. City will coordinate scheduling with District Facilities Department, not to exceed twelve months in advance of anticipated use. Scheduled use will be based on pool availability and program needs, and the parties shall exercise good faith efforts to agree to the joint use schedule and to resolve any conflicting uses.
- c. Auxiliary Facilities. If possible and agreed upon by the District, City's License shall include the ability to make use of auxiliary facilities including restroom facilities and storage areas in reasonable proximity to the pools. Auxiliary facilities and fixed equipment, such as parking lots, bleacher seats, and other fixtures designated for use in connection with such auxiliary facilities, shall be included herein.
- d. City Use During Regular District Hours. Subject to scheduling requirements and use priorities specified in Subsections (a) and (b) above, priority use of Pools shall be made available to the City for the Summer Swim Program for no facility use charge.
- e. Pool Maintenance and Repair. District is responsible for chemicals, maintenance, and repair of Pools. Outside of standard District maintenance operational hours (Monday-Friday, 7:00 a.m.-2:30 p.m.) and periods of co-use by City and District, City shall test chemical levels of Pools per industry standards and record the information in shared "pool chemical reading log." City shall make reasonable efforts to notify District of any issues with Pools during District maintenance operations hours and follow an agreed upon procedure to notify District outside of standard maintenance operational hours during holidays, evenings, and weekends.
- f. Downtime for Maintenance. When Pools are taken out of service for maintenance, repairs, and/or upgrades, activities cannot be scheduled during this time. District will notify City of the estimated downtime period as soon as issues are identified.

City Responsibilities.

 City is responsible for supervision of Pools during City programming set forth in this Agreement, with American Red Cross certified lifeguards, pool assistants and/or aides provided at all times during the Summer Swim Program. City is not responsible for supervising participants in programming operated by District or other third parties that may occur concurrent with City use. District to provide key(s) to City of Fresno.

- City will retain generated program revenue to offset staffing and site-specific instructional supply costs.
- c. City shall provide basic lifeguarding equipment to Pools such as rescue tubes, deck chairs, first aid kits, sunscreen, etc. City may place portable storage units at Pool sites in locations approved by District.
- d. City is responsible for locking and unlocking Pool access gates on days no District activities are scheduled and/or occurring. District and City will generate a locking and unlocking access gates schedule for the summer swim season.

4. District Responsibilities.

- a. Where City and District mutually agree upon City's use of auxiliary facilities per Section 2.c., District is responsible for providing custodial services for such auxiliary facilities at its expense.
- b. District shall provide for City's use of lifeguard stands and advanced lifeguarding equipment to Pools such as accessibility lift, shepherd's crook, backboard, etc. When using District equipment, City is responsible for examining and ensuring equipment is in good working condition and acceptable for use. District equipment must be stored and secured as found. Should vandalism and/or theft occur due to City's negligence, City shall be responsible for replacement.
- c. District is responsible for locking and unlocking access gates to Pools on days District activities precede and or extend past the standard City operating schedule. District and City will generate a locking and unlocking access gates schedule for the summer swim season. District to provide key(s) to City of Fresno.
- d. A walk-through will take place at each site prior to the commencement of the Summer Swim Program to orient City staff with specifics related to the pool and auxiliary facilities.
- 5. Indemnification. As authorized by Government Code Section 895.4, during the License Term; City shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend District and each of its officers, officials, employees, agents, and volunteers, from any and all loss, liability, fines, penalties, forfeitures, costs and damages (whether in contract, tort or strict liability, including but not limited to personal injury, death at any time and property damage) incurred by District, City or any other person, and from any and all claims, demands and actions in law or equity

(including attorney's fees and litigation expenses), arising or alleged to have arisen directly or indirectly out of the use of District facilities by City or any of its officers, officials, employees, agents, volunteers, or invitees. City's obligations under the preceding sentence shall apply regardless of whether District, or any of its officers, officials, employees, agents, or volunteers are passively negligent, but shall not apply to any loss, liability, fines, penalties, forfeitures, costs, or damages caused solely by the gross negligence, or caused by the willful misconduct of District or any of its officers, officials, employees, agents, or authorized volunteers. Nothing herein shall constitute a waiver by City of governmental immunities including California Government Code Section 810 et seq.

Throughout the life of this Agreement, City shall pay for and maintain in full force and effect all policies of insurance as required in Section 6, which is incorporated into and part of this Agreement, or as may be authorized or required in writing by District's Deputy Superintendent/Chief Financial Officer or designee at any time and in his/her sole discretion. The required policy(ies) of insurance as stated in Section 4 shall maintain limits of liability of not less than those amounts stated therein. However, the insurances limits available to District or any of its officers, officials, employees, agents, and volunteers as additional insureds, shall be the greater of the minimum limits specified therein or the full limit of any insurance proceeds available to the named insured.

City shall conduct all defenses at its sole cost. The fact that insurance is obtained by City shall not be deemed to release or diminish the liability of City, including, without limitation, liability assumed under this Agreement. The duty to indemnify shall apply to all claims, applicable to this agreement, regardless of whether any insurance policies are applicable. The duty to defend hereunder is wholly independent of and separate from the duty to indemnify and such duty to defend exists regardless of any ultimate liability of City. The policy limits do not act as a limitation upon the amount of defense and /or indemnification to be provided by City. Approval of purchase of any insurance contracts or policies shall in no way relieve from liability nor limit the liability of City, its officials, officers, employees, agents, volunteers, or invitees.

This section shall survive termination or expiration of this agreement.

- 6. <u>Insurance.</u> It is understood and agreed that District and City maintain insurance policies or self-insurance programs to fund their respective liabilities. Notwithstanding, City shall maintain, at its own cost, the following minimum insurance coverage and shall identify the District as an additional insured under the same:
 - Commercial general liability insurance. Said insurance shall not be less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence.
 - Commercial automobile liability insurance which shall cover all owned, non- owned and hired automobiles. Said insurance

- shall not be less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence.
- Workers' compensation and employer liability which shall not be less than \$1,000,000.
- d. Umbrella or excess liability insurance which shall provide the same coverage for additional insureds. The policy shall include coverage for bodily injury to a participant in any activity and shall not include a Participant's exclusion, athletic participant exclusion or a sub-limit liability for bodily injury to a participant.

Evidence of identifying the District as an additional insured shall be provided by the City upon request. Should City contract out any of the above responsibilities or obligation to this Agreement, City will require contractor, in writing, to indemnify and defend District as required in the License Agreement. Contractor will also be required to provide the following insurance requirements in favor of District and City.

- Funding Contingency. Except for the indemnity obligations specified herein, the obligations of City and District are limited to and contingent upon appropriation of sufficient funding in each fiscal year during the term of the Agreement.
- 8. <u>Independent Contractors.</u> The parties are acting as independent contractors. Neither party, nor any of its officers, associates, agents, or employees shall be deemed an employee, partner, or agent of the other for any purpose. Each party shall retain as program income any and all income generated by its respective use hereunder.
- 9. Notices. Any notice required or intended to be given to either party under the terms of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be duly given if delivered personally or deposited into the United States mail, with postage prepaid, addressed to the party to which notice is to be given at the party's address set forth on the signature page of this Agreement or at such other address as the parties may from time to time designate by written notice.

ITEM DESCRIPTION: Included in the Board binders are copies of 2023/24 Carl D. Perkins Applications for Funding. There are two separate applications, one each for the secondary and postsecondary (Adult School) Career Technical Education programs.

The postsecondary application is a consortium between Fresno Adult School and Clovis Adult School. The California Department of Education allows an adult school to join with another adult school to form a consortium; each adult school contributes to the annual reporting requirements. Fresno Adult School is the lead fiscal agent. Consortium funding is shared between members of the consortium based on the following criteria:

- 1. Joint Professional Learning opportunities for common Perkins funded pathway programs.
- 2. Identified Capital Outlay projects submitted by school for Perkins funded pathways.
- 3. Short-term program specific project proposals submitted to the consortium for funding.
- 4. Support of special populations in a Perkins funded pathway.
- 5. School specific Perkins funded program support needs.

The Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V) provides nearly \$1.3 billion in annual federal dollars to career and technical education for youth and adults. As a condition of receiving these funds, eligible recipients must submit a yearly online application that provides required descriptions and assurances related to the administration of the funds.

Perkins funding is contingent upon approval of the online application and Board approval.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: The estimated funding level for the 2023/24 school year for secondary is \$1,372,592 and \$126,716 for post-secondary.

ITEM DESCRIPTION: Included in the Board binders is information on Request for Proposals (RFP) 23-38, Fresh Juice and Dairy Products with Site Delivery Services to establish fixed pricing for delivery of fresh juice and dairy products with site delivery services to 105 school locations. These products are served in the School Breakfast Program, National School Lunch Program and the Super Snack Program, and are funded by reimbursement from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the California Department of Education. The RFP process allows for a variety of factors to be considered in addition to price, to identify the best value vendor for the district. The award recommendation is based on price, local procurement standards, delivery capacity, food safety, and technology and reports.

The request for proposals was lawfully advertised on February 24, 2023 and March 03, 2023. Proposals were opened on March 16, 2023. Notifications were sent to 63 vendors, and the district received two responses. The agreement is for a one-year term with the option to extend for two additional one-year periods. Staff recommends award of Schedule A to the best value vendor:

Producers Dairy Foods, Inc. (Fresno, California) \$4,788,640.40

Approval will allow the Nutrition Services Department to utilize fresh juice and dairy on an as-needed basis. Purchase orders will be presented to the Board for ratification on future purchase order reports.

Fresno Unified Board Policy (BP) 0420.4 Charter School Authorization

The Governing Board recognizes that charter schools may assist the district in offering diverse learning opportunities for students. In considering any petition for the to establishment of a charter school within the district, the Board shall give thoughtful consideration to the ability potential of the charter school to provide students with a sound high-quality educational program that enables them to achieve to their fullest potential. The shall consider whether the proposed charter school may accomplish the following: (a) improve pupil learning; (b) increase learning opportunities for all pupils, with special emphasis on expanded learning experiences for pupils who are identified as academically low-achieving; (c) encourage the use of different and innovative teaching methods; (d) create new professional opportunities for teachers, including the opportunity to be responsible for the learning program at the school site; (e) provide parents and pupils with expanded choices in the types of educational opportunities that are available within the public school system; (h) hold the charter school accountable for meeting measurable pupil outcomes, and provide the school with a method to change from rule-based to performance-based accountability systems; and (g) provide vigorous competition to stimulate continual improvements in all public schools. (Education Code 47601)

One or more persons seeking to establish a charter school may submit a petition to the Board for the astart-up charter school to be establishmented of a charter school that will operate within the geographic boundaries of the district. In addition, or to convert an existing public district school of the district may be converted to a charter school when deemed beneficial by the district and community. (Education Code 47605, 53300)

The district shall not require any district student to attend the charter school nor shall it require any district employee to work at the charter school. (Education Code 47605)

Any petition for a start up charter school or conversion charter school shall include the required number of parents or legal guardians meaningful interested in having their child or ward attend the charter school or teachers meaningfully interested in teaching at the charter school. The petition must also contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of all of the elements required by law and components, and signatures required by law, the accompanying administrative regulations. and shall be submitted to the Board. The Superintendent or designee shall consult with legal counsel, as appropriate, regarding compliance of the charter petition proposals with legal requirements.

The Superintendent or designee may work with charter school petitioners prior to the formal submission of the petition in order to ensure compliance of the petition with legal requirements. If the charter petition is granted, As needed, they the Superintendent or designee may also establish a Memorandum of Understanding with the charter operators may meet with the petitioners to establish workable plans for technical assistance or contracted services which the district may provide to the approved proposed charter school.

Timelines for Board Action

No later than Within 360 days after of receiving a charter petition to establish a charter school, the Board shall hold a public hearing on the charter provisions, at which time the Board shall consider to determine the level of support for the petition by teachers employed by the district, other district employees of the district, and parents/guardians. A petition is deemed received by the Board on the day

the petitioner submits a petition to the district's <u>Charter</u> office, along with a signed certification that the petitioner deems the petition to be complete. (Education Code 47605)

Following review of the petition and the public hearing, the Board shall either grant or deny the charter petition at a public hearing held within 90 days of receipt of the petition. That date may be extended an additional 30 days if the petitioner and the Board agree to the extension. Within 60 days of receiving a petition, or within 90 days with mutual consent of the petitioners and the Board, the Board shall either approve or deny the request to establish the charter school. (Education Code 47605)

(cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices)

At least 15 days before the public hearing at which the Board will either grant or deny the charter, the Board shall publish all staff recommendations regarding the petition, including any recommended findings and, if applicable, certification from the County Superintendent of Schools regarding the potential fiscal impact of the charter school on the district. At the public hearing to either grant or deny the charter, the petitioners shall have equivalent time and procedures to present evidence and testimony to respond to the staff recommendations and findings. (Education Code 47605)

The approval or denial of a charter petition shall not be controlled by collective bargaining agreements nor subject to review or regulation by the Public Employment Relations Board. (Education Code 47611.5)

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain accurate records, in relation to each charter petition, of documents submitted, the Board's proceedings, and the findings upon which the Board's decision to grant or deny the charter is made.

Approval of Petition

The Board shall approve the charter petition grant a charter for the operation of a charter school only if the Board is satisfied that granting the charter doing so is consistent with sound educational practice and with the interests of the community in which the school is proposing to locate. In granting charters, the Board shall consider the academic needs of the students the charter school proposes to serve and shall not deny a petition for the establishment of a charter school unless it makes written factual findings specific to the petition. The Board shall give preference to schools petitions that demonstrate the capability best able to provide comprehensive learning experiences to for students identified by the petitioners as academically low-achieving, students according to pursuant to the standards established by the California Department of Education (CDE) under Education Code 54032. (Education Code 47605)

The Board may initially grant a charter for a specified term not to exceed five years. (Education Code-47607)

(cf. 0420.42 - Charter School Renewal) (cf. 0420.43 - Charter School Revocation,

Prior to granting a charter petition. The Board shall ensure verify that any approved the charter contains includes adequate processes and measures for oversight monitoring and holding the school accountable for fulfilling the terms of its charter, and complying with all applicable laws, including Education Code 47604.1. These Such processes and measures shall include, but are not be limited to, fiscal accountability systems, multiple measures for evaluating the educational program, inspection and observation of the charter school, including student outcomes aligned with state priorities as described in Education Code 52060, and regular reports to the Board.

The approval or denial of a charter petition shall not be controlled by collective bargaining agreements nor subject to review or regulation by the Public Employment Relations Board. (Education Code 47611.5)

The Board may initially grant a charter for a specified term not to exceed five years. (Education Code 47607)

After a charter petition is granted The Board may enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the charter operator for the term of the charter approve one or more memoranda of understanding to clarify the financial and operational agreements between the district and the charter school. Any such Memorandum of Understanding may be annually reviewed by the Board and charter school governing body and amended as necessary per the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding.

(cf. 0420.42 - Charter School Renewal) (cf. 0420.43 - Charter School Revocation)

<u>Upon approval of the petition by the Board, the petitioners litted</u> to shall be the responsib<u>leility for of the petitioners to providinge</u> written notice of the Board's approval and a copy of the charter <u>petition</u> to the County Superintendent of Schools, the CDE, and the State Board of Education (SBE). (Education Code 47605)

Denial of Petition

The Board shall deny any petition to authorize the conversion of a private school to a charter school. The Board shall also deny any petition for a charter that proposes to serve students in a grade level that is not served by the district, unless the petition proposes to serve students in all the grade levels served by the district. (Education Code 47602, 47605)

The Board shall summarily deny any charter petition that proposes to:

- 1. Operate a charter school as or by a for-profit corporation, a for-profit educational management organization, or a for-profit charter management organization (Education Code 47604)
- 2. Convert a private school to a charter school (Education Code 47602)
- 3. Serve students in a grade level that is not served by the district, unless the petition proposes to serve students in all of the grade levels served by the district (Education Code 47605)
- 4. Offer nonclassroom-based instruction (Education Code 47612.7)

Regarding all Any other charter petitions, the Board shall not deny a petition be denied for the establishment of a charter school unless only if the Board makes written factual findings, specific to the particular petition, setting forth specific facts to support that one or more of the following findings conditions exist: (Education Code 47605; 5 CCR 11967.5.1)

- 1. The charter school presents an unsound educational program for the students to be enrolled in the charter school.
- 2. The petitioners are demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition.
- The petition does not contain the required number of signatures required.
- 4. The The petition does not contain an affirmation of each of the conditions that the charter school will be nonsectarian in its programs, admission policies, employment practices, and all other operations, shall not charge tuition, and shall not discriminate against a pupil on the basis of the characteristics listed in Education Code 47605(de). (Education Code 220)
- 5. The petition does not contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of <u>all of the following</u>: the

charter provisions in Education Code 47605(b).

- A. The educational program of the charter school.
- B. The measurable student outcomes identified by the charter school.
- C. The method by which student progress is to be measured.
- D. The governance structure of the charter school.
- E. The qualifications to be met by individuals to be employed by the charter school.
- F. The procedures the charter school will follow to ensure the health and safety of students and staff.
- G. The means by which the charter school will achieve a balance of racial and ethnic students, special education students, and English learner students that is reflective of the general population residing within the territorial jurisdiction of the District.
- H. Admissions policies and procedures.
- I. The manner in which annual, independent financial audits shall be conducted.
- J. The procedures by which students can be suspended or expelled from the charter school.
- K. The manner by which staff members of the charter school will be covered by the State Teachers' Retirement System, the Public Employees' Retirement System, or federal social security.
- L. The public school attendance alternatives for students residing within the District who choose not to attend the charter school.
- M. The rights of a District employee upon leaving the District's employment to work in the charter school and any rights of return to the District after employment at the charter school.
- N. <u>The procedures to be followed by the charter school and the chartering authority to resolve disputes relating to provisions of the charter.</u>
- O. The procedures to be used if the charter school closes.
- 6. The petition does not contain a declaration of as to whether or not the charter school shall be deemed the exclusive public school employer of the school's employees for purposes of collective bargaining pursuant to Government Code 3540-3549.3.
- 7. The charter school is demonstrably unlikely to serve the interests of the entire community in which the school is proposing to locate. Analysis of this finding shall include consideration of the fiscal impact of the proposed charter school. A written factual finding shall detail specific facts and circumstances that analyze and consider the following factors:
 - a. The extent to which the proposed charter school would substantially undermine existing services, academic offerings, or programmatic offerings
 - b. Whether the proposed charter school would duplicate a program currently offered within the district and whether, when the existing program has sufficient capacity for the students proposed to be served within reasonable proximity to where the charter school intends to locate
- 8. The district is not positioned to absorb the fiscal impact of the proposed charter school. The district satisfies this criterion if it has a qualified interim certification and the County Superintendent certifies that approving the charter school would result in the district having a negative interim certification, has a negative interim certification, or is under the state receivership. (Education Code 47605.7, 5 CCR 11967.5.1)

The Board shall not deny a petition based on the actual or potential costs of serving students with exceptional needs, which is defined in Education Code 56026 disabilities, nor shall it refuse to grant deny a petition solely because the charter school might enroll students with disabilities who reside outside the special education local plan area in which the district participates. (Education Code 47605.7, 47647)

(cf. 0430 - Comprehensive Local Plan for Special Education)

If the Board denies a petition, the petitioners may <u>elect</u> choose to submit the <u>charter</u> petition to the County Board of Education <u>within 30 days of the denial by the district.</u> If <u>and, if then denied by the County Board denies the petition, the petitioners may appeal that denial</u>, to the SBE <u>within 30 days</u> of the denial by the County Board. (Education Code 47605)

At the request of the petitioner, the Board shall prepare the documentary record, including a transcript of the public hearing at which the Board denied the charter, no later than 10 business days after the petitioner makes the request. (Education Code 47605)

Within 30 days of receipt of an appeal submitted to SBE, the Board may submit a written opposition to SBE detailing, with specific citations to the documentary record, how the Board did not abuse its discretion in denying the petition. (Education Code 47605)

If either the County Board or SBE remands the petition to the Board because the petition on appeal contains new or different material terms, the Board shall reconsider the petition and shall grant or deny the petition within 30 days. (Education Code 47605)

Fresno Unified Board Policy (BP) 0420.41 Charter School Oversight

The Governing Board recognizes its ongoing responsibility <u>and duty</u> to <u>ensure</u> oversee <u>a that any</u> charter school authorized by the Board <u>and ensure that the charter school</u> is successfully fulfilling the terms of its charter and is providing a <u>sound</u> <u>high-quality</u> educational program for students enrolled in the charter school.

(cf. 0420.4 - Charter School Authorization) (cf. 0500 - Accountability)

The Superintendent or designee shall identify at least one staff member to serve as a contact person for each charter school. (Education Code 47604.32)

The Board and Superintendent or designee may inspect or observe any part of the charter school at any time. The Superintendent or designatedee charter school contact shall visit each charter school at least annually and may inspect or observe any part of a charter school at any time. (Education Code 47604.32, 47607)

When ever the Board grants a charter school operated as or is operated by a nonprofit public benefit corporation as authorized by Education Code 47604, the Superintendent may recommend and the Board may appoint a the district shall be entitled to a single representative, who may be the district's charter school contact, on the corporation's board of directors of the nonprofit public benefit corporation. (Education Code 47604)

The Superintendent or designated charter school contact shall attend meetings of the charter school governing body whenever possible and shall periodically meet with a representative of the charter school.

The district shall ensure that a charter school complies with all reports required of charter schools by law, including the local control and accountability plan and annual update to the local control and accountability plan, and shall monitor the fiscal condition of a charter school. (Education Code 47604.32)

The district shall not be liable for the debts or obligations of a charter school or for claims arising from the performance of acts, errors, or omissions by a charter school when the District complies with all oversight responsibilities required by law. (Education Code 47604)

Waivers

A charter school shall comply with all provisions of the Charter Schools Act but is otherwise exempt from the laws governing school districts except as set forth in Education Code 47610. If the charter school wishes to request a general waiver of any state law or regulation applicable to it, it shall request that the district submit a general waiver request to the State Board of Education (SBE) on its behalf. Upon approval of the Board, the Superintendent or designee shall submit such a apply for the waiver request to the SBE on behalf of the charter school.

(cf. 1431 - Waivers)

Provision of District Services

The charter school may <u>separately</u> purchase administrative or other services from the district or any other source. (Education Code 47613)

Whenever the district agrees to provide administrative or support services to a charter school, the district and charter school shall develop a memorandum of understanding which clarifies the financial and operational agreements between them the district and charter school.

At the request of a charter school, the Superintendent or designee shall create and submit any reports required by the State Teachers' Retirement System or Public Employees' Retirement System on behalf of the charter school. The district may charge the charter school may be charged for the actual costs of the reporting services. The district but shall not require the charter school be required to purchase payroll processing services from the district as a condition for creating and submitting these reports. (Education Code 47611.3)

Material Revisions to Charter

Material revisions of the provisions of to a charter petition may be made only with Board approval.

Material revisions shall be governed by the same standards and criteria described that apply to new-charter petitions as set forth in Education Code 47605. Material revisions and shall include, but not be limited to, a reasonably comprehensive description of any new requirement of for charter schools enacted into law after the charter was originally granted or last renewed. (Education Code 47607)

If an approved charter school proposes to expand operations to one or more additional sites or grade levels, within the district's boundaries, the charter school shall request a material revision to its charter and shall notify the Board of the one or more those additional sites locations or grade levels. The Board shall consider approval of the additional locations at an open meeting. (Education Code 476075)

The findings of Education Code 47605(c)(7)-(8) shall not be used by the Board to deny a renewal of an existing charter school, but may be used to deny a proposed expansion constituting a material revision. For such a material revision, this analysis shall be limited to consideration only of the impact of the proposed material revision. (Education Code 47607)

The Board shall have the authority to determine whether a proposed change to a in charter petition school operations constitutes a material revision.

Monitoring Charter School Performance

The Superintendent or designee shall monitor the each charter school that is authorized by the district to determine whether it complies with all legal requirements applicable to charter schools, including making all reports required of charter schools by law in accordance with Education Code 47604.32. Any violations of law by a charter school shall be reported to the Board.

The Board shall monitor each charter school to determine whether it is achieving the measurable student outcomes set forth in the charter, both schoolwide and for each numerically significant student subgroup all groups of students served by the charter school, as defined in Education Code 52052the measurable student outcomes set forth in the charter. This determination shall be based on the methods measures specified in the approved charter for measuring student outcomes, any applicable provisions in the Memorandum of Understanding between the district and the charter school, and the charter school's annual review and assessment of its progress toward the goals and actions identified in its local control and accountability plan (LCAP), as reported in the California School Dashboard. shall include, at a minimum, a consideration of whether the school is meeting its Academic Performance Index growth targets established pursuant to Education Code 52052 and is making "adequate yearly progress" (AYP) pursuant to 20 USC 6311, as applicable.

The Board shall monitor the fiscal condition of the charter school based on <u>all any</u> financial <u>reports and/or</u> information <u>submitted by obtained from</u> the charter school, including, but not limited to, the charter school's preliminary budget, <u>the charter school's LCAP</u>, and <u>the final unaudited report for the full prior year.</u> (Education Code 47604.32, 47604.33, 47606.5)

Fees/Charges for Supervisorial Oversight

The district may charge a charter school for the actual costs of supervisorial of the charter school not to exceed up to one percent of a charter school's revenue for the actual costs of supervisorial oversight of the school. However, if the charter school district is able to provide obtain substantially rent-free facilities to the charter school from the district, the district may charge for actual costs of supervisorial oversight of the charter school not to exceed up to three percent of the charter school's revenue. (Education Code 47613)

If the facility obtained by the charter school is provided pursuant to Education Code 47614, the pro-rata share facilities costs calculated pursuant to 5 CCR 11969.7 shall be charged. When the district charges this pro-rata share, the district may also charge for the actual costs of supervisorial oversight of the charter school not to exceed one percent of the charter school's revenue. If the district is given responsibility for supervisorial oversight of a charter school that was authorized pursuant to Education code 47605(k)(1), the district may charge for the actual costs of supervisorial oversight and for the administrative costs necessary to secure charter school funding. (Education Code 47613)

(cf. 7160 - Charter School Facilities) Technical Assistance/Intervention

If a charter school receiving federal Title I funding fails to make AYP, as defined pursuant to 20 USC 6311, for two or more consecutive years, the school shall be identified for program improvement and shall implement improvement strategies in accordance with 20 USC 6316.

(cf. 0520.2 - Title I Program Improvement Schools)

Using the evaluation rubric adopted by the SBE, a charter school for which one or more numerically significant student subgroups meet the SBE-established performance criteria in two or more years, the County Superintendent of Schools shall provide technical assistance focused on building the charter school's capacity to develop and implement actions and services responsive to student and community needs, including, but not limited to, any of the following: (Education Code 45607.3)

- 1. Assisting the charter school to identify its strengths and weaknesses in regard to the state priorities applicable to the charter school pursuant to Education Code 47605(c). This shall include working collaboratively with the charter school to review performance data on the state and local indicators included in the California School Dashboard and other relevant local data and to identify effective, evidence-based programs or practices that address any areas of weakness.
- Working collaboratively with the charter school to secure assistance from an academic, programmatic, or fiscal expert or team of experts to identify and implement effective programs and practices that are designed to improve performance in any areas of weakness identified by the charter school. The County Superintendent of Schools, in consultation with the charter school, may solicit another service provider, including, but not limited to, a school district, county office of education, or charter school, to act as a partner to the charter school in need of technical assistance.
- 3. Obtaining from the charter school timely documentation demonstrating that it has completed the activities described in paragraphs #1 and 2, or substantially similar activities, or has selected another service provider to work with the charter school to complete the activities described in paragraphs #1 and 2, or

substantially similar activities, and ongoing communication with the Board to assess the charter school's progress in improving student outcomes. (Education Code 45607.3)

In addition, I if, in three out of four consecutive school years, a charter school fails to improve outcomes for three or more student numerically significant student subgroups, identified in Education Code 52052, or, if for all of the student subgroups if the charter school has less fewer than three numerically significant student subgroups, in regard to one or more state or school priorities identified in the charter, the district: the County Superintendent of Schools may request from the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence. The California Collaborative for Excellence, after consulting with the Superintendent of Public Instruction (SPI), and with the SBE, may provide advice and assistance to the charter school (Education Code 47607.3)

The Board shall consider for revocation any charter school to which the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence has provided advice and assistance and has made either of the following findings, which shall be submitted to the Board:

- 1. Shall provide technical assistance to the charter school using an evaluation rubric adopted by the SBE-pursuant to Education Code 52064.5 that the charter school has failed, or is unable, to implement the recommendations of the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence; or
- 2. May request that the Superintendent of Public Instruction (SPI), with SBE approval, assign the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence to provide advice and assistance to the charter school pursuant to Education Code 52074 that the inadequate performance of the charter school, based upon the adopted evaluation rubric, is either so persistent or so acute as to require revocation of the charter. The Board shall consider increases in student academic achievement for all numerically significant student subgroups served by the charter school in determining whether to revoke the charter (Education Code 47607.3)

In accordance with law, the Board may deny a charter's renewal petition or may revoke a charter based on the charter school's poor performance, especially with regards to the academic achievement of all numerically significant subgroups of students served by the charter school.

(cf. 0420.42 - Charter School Renewal) (cf. 0420.43 - Charter School Revocation)

Complaints

Each charter school shall establish and maintain processes policies and procedures to enable any person to file a complaint, in accordance with the uniform complaint procedures set forth as specified in 5 CCR 4600-4687707. A complaint that a charter has not complied with the requirements of alleging the school's noncompliance with Education Code 47606.5 and or 47607.3 may be filed with the charter school pursuant to the Uniform Complaint Procedures. Complaints may be filed anonymously if the complaint provided evidence or information leading to evidence to support an allegation of noncompliant. (Education Code 52075)

(cf. 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures)

A complainant who is not satisfied with the decision of the charter school may appeal the decision to the SPI. (Education Code 52075)

If the charter school finds merit in the complaint, or the SPI finds merit in an appeal, the charter school shall provide a remedy shall be provided to all affected students and parents/guardians. (Education Code 52075)

School Closure

In the event that the Board revokes <u>a charter</u> or denies renewal of a charter, or <u>if</u> the <u>charter</u> school <u>closes</u>ceases <u>operation</u> for any <u>other</u> reason, the Superintendent or designee <u>may shall</u>, when applicable in accordance with the charter and/or a <u>Mm</u>emorandum of <u>Uunderstanding</u>, provide assistance to facilitate the transfer of the charter school's former students and to finalize financial reporting and close-out.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide <u>timely</u> notification to the California Department of Education (CDE), within 10 calendar days of the Board's action if <u>any of the following circumstances occur with regard to a charter school;</u> renewal of the charter is denied; the charter is revoked; <u>ifor</u> the charter school will cease operation for any reason.

Such notification to the CDE shall at least include, but not be limited to, a description of the circumstances of the closure, the effective date of the closure, and the location of student and personnel records. (Education Code 47604.32; 5 CCR 11962.1)

Fresno Unified Board Policy (BP) 0420.42 Charter School Renewal

The Governing Board believes that the <u>renewal</u> <u>ongoing operation</u> of a charter school <u>established within</u> <u>the district</u> should be dependent on the school's effectiveness in achieving its mission and goals for student learning and other student outcomes. Whenever a charter school submits a petition for renewal of its charter, the Board shall review the petition thoroughly and in a timely manner.

(cf. 0420.4 - Charter School Authorization) (cf. 0420.41 - Charter School Oversight) (cf. 0420.43 - Charter School Revocation) (cf. 0500 - Accountability)

A charter school submits a charter renewal petition shall not be operated as or by a for-profit corporation, a for-profit educational management organization, or a for-profit charter management organization. (Education Code 47604)

When a charter school, concurrently with its renewal petition, proposes to expand operations to one or more additional sites or grade levels, the charter school shall request a material revision to its charter. The material revision may be made only with the approval of the Board. The material revision shall be governed by the standards and criteria described in Education Code 47605. Each renewal granted by the Board shall be for a period of five years. (Education Code 47607)

Submission of Renewal Petition

The Board recommends that Aa charter school seeking renewal of its charter is encouraged to petition for renewal to the Board with sufficiently time early before the expiration of the term of the charter is due to expire to allow the Board's deliberations and decision on the renewal petition to be completed prior to the end of the term.

The signature requirement applicable to new charter is not applicable to petitions for renewal. (5 CCR 11966.4 Education Code 47607)

Renewals of charters are governed by Education Code 47605 and the petition for renewal shall include, but not be limited to, a reasonably comprehensive description of any new requirements of charter schools and how the charter school has met all new charter school requirements enacted into law after the charter was originally granted or last renewed. The petition also shall include documentation that the charter school meets at least one of the criteria for academic performance specified in Education Code 47607(b), as listed in item #5 in the section "Criteria for Granting or Denying Renewal" below. (Education Code 47607; 5 CCR 11966.4)

Criteria for Granting or Denying Renewal

All charter schools whose term expires on or between January 1, 2022, and June 30, 2025, shall have their term extended by two years. (Education Code 47607.4)

When considering whether to renew a charter petition, if the two consecutive years immediately preceding the renewal decision include the 2019-20 or 2020-21 school year, the Board shall review two of the most recent years for which state data is available preceding the renewal decision. (Education 47607, 47607.2)

For purposes of renewal, measurements of academic performance means indicators included in the adopted

evaluation rubrics that are based on statewide assessments. The determination of a charter school's academic progress is based on all the state indicators in the California School Dashboard for which it receives performance levels, provided that the charter school has schoolwide performance levels on at least two measurements of academic performance per year and for at least two numerically significant student subgroups. If the dashboard indicators are not yet available for the most recently completed academic year before renewal, the Board shall consider verifiable data provided by the charter school related to the dashboard indicators. The State Board of Education approved a list of valid and reliable indicators of academic progress and postsecondary outcomes that may be used to demonstrate a charter school's academic performance. (Education Code 47607)

Renewals shall be governed by the same standards and criteria for the establishment of a charter school described that apply to new charter petitions as set forth in Education Code 47605. The Board shall consider the past performance of the charter school's academics, finances, and operations in evaluating the likelihood of future success, along with plans for improvement, if any. A charter renewal shall not be denied based on findings that the charter school is demonstrably unlikely to serve the interests of the entire community in which the school is located or that the district is not positioned to absorb the fiscal impact of the charter school pursuant to Education Code 47605. However, for a material revision concurrent with the renewal to expand operations to one or more additional sites or grade levels, the Board shall consider the impact of the proposed material revision using these provisions. (Education Code 47607; 5 CCR 11966.4)

The signature requirement in Education Code 47605 for the establishment of a charter school is not applicable to petitions for renewal. (5 CCR 11966.4)

Following the Board's review, a renewal of the charter petition may be granted in accordance with a three-tiered system based on school performance, as follows:

- 1. Renewal of Five to Seven Years
- The Board shall not deny renewal for a charter school and may renew the charter petition for a period between five and seven years if either of the following apply for two consecutive years immediately preceding the renewal decision:
- a. The charter school has received the two highest performance levels schoolwide on all the state indicators included in the evaluation rubrics shown on the California School Dashboard for which the charter school receives performance levels
- b. For all measurements of academic performance, the charter school has received performance levels schoolwide that are the same or higher than the state average and, for a majority of numerically significant student subgroups performing statewide below the state average in each respective year, received performance levels that are higher than the state average (Education Code 47607(c))

A charter school eligible for technical assistance pursuant to Education Code 47607.3 shall not qualify for renewal for a period of between five and seven years.

A charter school that satisfies the criteria for this renewal shall only be required to update its charter petition to include a reasonably comprehensive description of any new requirement of charter schools enacted into law after the charter petition was originally granted or last renewed and as necessary to reflect the current program offered by the charter school.

2. Renewal of Five Years

For a renewal of a charter school for which the above does not apply, In determining whether to grant a charter renewal, the Board shall consider the schoolwide performance and performance of increases in

academic achievement for all numerically significant student subgroups served by the charter school, on the state and local indicators included in the evaluation rubrics shown on the California School Dashboard. The Board shall provide greater weight to performance on measurements of academic performance in determining whether to grant renewal for such a charter school as defined in Education Code 52052, as the most important factor: (Education Code 47607.2)

In addition to the state and local indicators, the Board shall consider clear and convincing evidence, demonstrated by verified data, showing either of the following:

- (a) <u>The charter school achieved</u> measurable increases in academic achievement, as defined by at least one year's progress for each year in school
- (b) Strong postsecondary outcomes, as defined by college enrollment, persistence, and completion rates equal to similar peers (Education Code 47607.2)

<u>Verified data means data derived from nationally recognized, valid, peer-reviewed, and reliable sources that are externally produced. Verified data shall include measures of postsecondary outcomes. (Education Code 47607.2(c))</u>

For any such charter school, the Board may deny the renewal petition only upon making written findings, setting forth specific facts to support the findings, that the charter school has failed to meet or make sufficient progress toward meeting standards that provide a benefit to the students of the school, that closure of the charter school is in the best interest of students, and that the Board's decision provided greater weight to performance on measurements of academic performance. (Education Code 47607.2)

For a charter school renewed pursuant to this criteria, the Board shall grant a renewal for a period of five years.

- 3. Denial with Option for Two-Year Renewal
- The Board shall not renew a charter if either of the following apply for two consecutive years immediately preceding the renewal decision: (Education Code 47607.2)
- (a) The charter school has received the two lowest performance levels schoolwide on all the state indicators included in the evaluation rubrics shown on the California School Dashboard for which it receives performance levels.
- (b) For all measurements of academic performance, the charter school has received performance levels schoolwide that are the same or lower than the state average and, for a majority of numerically significant student subgroups performing statewide below the state average in each respective year, received performance levels that are lower than the state average. (Education Code 47607.2(a))

However, the Board shall consider the following factors and may renew a charter petition that meets such criteria only upon making both of the following written factual findings, specific to the particular petition, setting forth specific facts to support the findings:

- (a) The charter school is taking meaningful steps to address the underlying cause(s) of low performance, and those steps are reflected, or will be reflected, in a written plan adopted by the governing body of the charter school.
- (b) There is clear and convincing evidence, demonstrated by verified data, showing either of the following:
 (i) the charter school achieved measurable increases in academic achievement, as defined by at least year's progress for each year in school; or
- (ii) strong postsecondary outcomes, as defined by college enrollment, persistence, and competition rates equal to similar peers

For a charter petition renewed pursuant to these written factual findings, the Board may grant a renewal for a period of two years. (Education Code § 47607.2(a))

Notwithstanding all of the above, the Board may deny renewal of a charter upon a finding that the school is demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition due to substantial fiscal or governance factors or is not serving all students who wish to attend. The Board may deny renewal of the charter school only after it has provided at least 30 days' notice to the charter school of the alleged violation and provided the charter school with a reasonable opportunity to cure the violation, including a corrective action plan proposed by the charter school. The Board may deny renewal only by making either of the following findings:

- (i) corrective action proposed by the charter school has been unsuccessful; or
- (ii) the violations are sufficiently severe and pervasive as to render a corrective action plan unviable. Any finding that a school is not serving all students who wish to attend shall specifically identify the evidence supporting the finding. (Education Code 47607)

<u>Upon making</u> a finding that a <u>charter</u> school is not serving all students who wish to attend, the Board shall specifically identify the evidence supporting the finding. (Education Code 47607)

The Board shall deny a renewal petition only if it makes a written factual finding setting forth specific facts to support one or more of the following grounds: (Education Code 47605, 47607; 5 CCR 11966.4)

- 1. The charter school presents an unsound educational program for the students enrolled in the school.
- 2. The petitioners are demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition.
- The petition does not contain an affirmation of each of the conditions described in Education Code 47605(d).
- 4. The petition does not contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of the charter provisions in Education Code 47605(b).
- 5. The charter school has failed to meet at least one of the following criteria of academic performance:
- 1. Attainment of its Academic Performance Index (API) growth target in the prior year or in two of the last three years, both schoolwide and for all numerically significant groups of students served by the charter school as defined in Education Code 52052.
- 2. An API ranking in deciles 4-10 in the prior year or in two of the last three years.
- 3. An API ranking in deciles 4-10 for a demographically comparable school in theprior year or in two of the last three year.
- 4. Academic performance at least equal to the academic performance of the public schools that the charter school students would otherwise have been required to attend as well as the academic performance of district schools, taking into account the composition of the student population that is served at the charter school. In determining whether the charter school satisfies this criterion, the Board shall base its decision on:
- (1) Documented clear and convincing data
- (2) Student achievement data from assessments, including, but not limited to, the Standardized Testing and Reporting Program, for demographically similar student populations in comparison schools
- (3) Information submitted by the charter school

Whenever the Board makes a determination based on this criterion, the Superintendent or designee shall submit copies of supporting documentation and a written summary of the basis for the Board's determination to the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

e. Qualification for an alternative accountability system pursuant to Education Code 52052(h)

None of the above criteria shall apply to a charter school that is eligible for alternative methods for calculating the state and local indicators and is designated as Dashboard Alternative School Status (DASS). Instead, in determining whether to grant a charter renewal for such a charter school, the Board shall consider, in addition to the charter school's performance on the state and local indicators included in the evaluation rubrics shown on the California School Dashboard, the charter school's performance on alternative metrics applicable to the charter school based on the student population served. The Board shall meet with the charter school during the first year of the charter school's term to mutually agree to discuss alternative metrics to be considered and shall notify the charter school of the alternative metrics to be used within 30 days of this meeting. The Board may deny a charter renewal only upon making written findings, setting forth specific facts to support the findings, that the closure of the charter school is in the best interest of students. (Education Code 47607(c)(7))

Timelines for Board Action

No later than Within 30-60 days after of receipt of receiving the renewal petition by the Board, the Board shall hold a public hearing on the provisions of the renewal petition and to consider the level of support for the renewal petition review documentation submitted by the charter school and obtain public input. A petition is deemed received by the Board on the day the petitioner submits a petition to the district's Charter office, along with a signed certification that the petitioner deems the petition to be complete. (Education Code 47605)

Within 60 days of receiving the renewal petition, or within 90 days if extended by mutual written agreement of the Board and the charter school, the Following review of the petition and the public hearing, the Board shall either grant or deny the request to renew the charter renewal petition at a public hearing held within 90 days of receipt of the renewal petition. That date may be extended an additional 30 days if the petitioner and the Board agree to the extension. (Education Code 4760547607; 5 CCR 11966.4)

At least 15 days before the public hearing at which the Board will either grant or deny the charter renewal petition, the Board shall publish all staff recommendations regarding the petition, including any recommended findings. At the public hearing to either grant or deny the renewal petition, petitioners shall have equivalent time and procedures to present evidence and testimony to respond to the staff recommendations and findings. (Education Code 47605)

If the charter school submits documentation pursuant to item #5d in the section "Criteria for Granting or Denying Renewal" above, the Board shall not grant a renewal until at least 30 days after the submission of such documentation. (Education Code 47607)

If the Board fails to make a written factual finding pursuant to items #1-5 in the section "Criteria for-Granting or Denying Renewal" above within the required time period, the absence of a written factualfinding shall be deemed an approval of the renewal petition. (5 CCR 11966.4)

The Superintendent or designee shall provide <u>timely</u> notification to the California Department of Education (CDE), within 10 calendar days of the <u>official action taken by the</u> Board's action, whenever a renewal of the charter is granted or denied. (Education Code 47604.32; 5 CCR 11962.1)

If the Board does not grant denies a renewal to a charter petition, the charter school may appeal the decision pursuant to the procedures pertaining to a denial of a petition for establishment of a charter school as provided in Education Code 47605 (k) submit its application for renewal to the County Board of Education within 30 days of the Board's written factual findings supporting the denial. If the County Board then fails to deny or grant the petition within 60 days of receiving the petition, or within 90 days if extended by written mutual agreement of the charter school and the County Board, the charter school may submit the petition to the State Board of Education. (Education Code 47605, 47607.5)

School Closure

If a charter is not renewed and the charter school ceases operation, the charter school shall implement the school closure procedures specified in the charter in accordance with Education Code 47605 and 5 CCR 11962.

The Governing Board expects all any charter schools it authorizes to provide a sound educational program that promotes student learning and to carry out their its operations in a manner that complies with law and the terms of its charter. The Board may revoke a charter in accordance with law (Education Code 47607).

The Board may revoke a charter, if the Board finds, before the date it is due to expire whenever the Board makes a written factual finding, supported by through a showing of substantial evidence, that the charter school did has done any of the following: (Education Code 47607(f))

- 1. Committed a material violation of any of the conditions, standards, or procedures set forth in the charter
- 2. Failed to meet or pursue any of the student outcomes identified in the charter
- 3. Failed to meet generally accepted accounting principles or engaged in fiscal mismanagement
- 4. Violated any provision of law

When the Board determines, in writing, that any violation under Education Code 47607(f) constitutes a severe and imminent threat to the health or safety of students, the Board may immediately revoke the school's charter by approving and delivering a Notice of Revocation by Determination of a Severe and Imminent Threat to Student Health or Safety to the charter school's governing body, the County Board of Education, and the California Department of Education (CDE) (Education Code 47607; 5 CCR 11968.5.3)

The Board shall also consider for revocation any charter school to which the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence (CCEE) has provided advice and assistance pursuant to Education Code 47607.3(c) and about which the CCEE has made either of the following findings, which shall be submitted to the Board: (Education Code 47607.3(d))

- 1. That the charter school, has failed or is unable, to implement the recommendations of the CCEE
- 2. That the inadequate performance of the charter school, based upon an evaluation rubric shown on the California School Dashboard, is either so persistent or so acute as to require revocation of the charter

In determining whether to revoke the charter, the Board shall consider increases in student academic achievement for all numerically significant student subgroups served by the charter school, as defined in Education Code 52052. (Education Code 47607, 47607.3)

Revocation Procedures

If the Board takes action to issue a Notice of Violation, is considering revoking a charter, the Board it shall deliver a Notice of Violation to the charter school's governing body. The Notice of Violation is the written notice of the Board's identification of one or more of the specific alleged violations by the charter school. This notice shall identify all of the following: (Education Code 47607; 5 CCR 11965, 11968.5.2)

- 1. The charter school's alleged specific violation(s).
- 2. All evidence relied upon by the Board in determining the charter school engaged in any of the acts or omissions identified including the date and duration of the alleged violation(s), showing the violation(s) are both material and uncured, and that the alleged violations(s) occurred within a reasonable period of time before the Notice of Violation is issued.

3. The period of time that the Board has concluded is a reasonable period of time for the charter school to remedy or refute the identified violation(s). In identifying this time period, the Board shall consider the amount of time reasonably necessary to remedy each identified violation, which may include the charter school's estimation as to the anticipated remediation time.

In determining wether to revoke a charter, the Board shall consider increases in student academic achievement for all "numerically significant" groups of students served by the charter school, as defined in Education Code 52052, as the most important factor. (Education Code 47607)

At least 72 hours prior to any Board meeting in at which the Board will consider issuing a Notice of Violation, the Board shall provide the charter school with notice and all relevant documents related to the proposed action. (5 CCR 11968.5.2)

(cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices)

- 1. The charter school's alleged violation(s).
- 2. All evidence relied upon by the Board in determining that the charter school committed the alleged violation(s), including the date and duration of the alleged violation(s). The Notice shall show that each alleged violation is both material and uncured and that it occurred within a reasonable period of time before the Notice of Violation is issued.
- 3. The period of time that the Board has concluded is a reasonable period of time for the charter school to remedy or refute the identified violation(s). In identifying this time period, the Board shall consider the amount of time reasonably necessary to remedy each identified violation, which may include the charter school's estimation as to the anticipated remediation time.

<u>Upon receipt of By the end of the remedy period identified in</u> the Notice of Violation, the charter school's governing body <u>if it chooses to response</u>, <u>shall take the following actions:</u>

- (1) may submit to the Board a detailed, written response and supporting evidence addressing each identified violation, including, the refutation, remedial action taken, or proposed remedial action by the charter school specific to each alleged violation, which shall be due by the end of the remedy period identified in the Notice of Violation; and
- (2) attach to its written response supporting evidence of the refutation, remedial action, or proposed remedial action, if any, including written reports, statements, and other appropriate documentation. (5 CCR 11968.5.2)

After Within 60 calendar days of the conclusion of the reasonable opportunity to remedy period specified in the Notice of Violation, the Board shall evaluate the any response of and supporting evidence provided by the charter school's governing body to the Notice of Violation and any supporting evidence, if submitted, and shall take one of the following actions: (5 CCR 11968.5.2)

- 1. If the Board has substantial evidence that the charter school has failed to refute to the Board's satisfaction, or remedy a violation identified in the Notice of Violation, continue revocation of the school's charter by issuing a Notice of Intent to Revoke to the charter school's governing body; or
- 2. Discontinue revocation of the <u>school's</u> charter and provide timely written notice of such action to the charter school's governing body
- 3. If there is substantial evidence that the charter school has failed to remedy a violation identified in the Notice of Violation or to refute a violation to the Board's satisfaction, continue revocation of the charter by issuing a Notice of Intent to Revoke to the charter school's governing body

If the Board does not take one of the above actions within 60 calendar days of the conclusion of the remedy period specified in the Notice of Violation, the revocation process is terminated and the Notice of Violation is void. (5 CCR 11968.5.2)

If the Board chooses to continue revocation of the charter school by issuesing a written Notice of Intent to Revoke due to the charter school's failure to remedy one or more violations identified in the Notice of Violation, the Notice of Intent to Revoke shall identify all of the following:

(1) All evidence relied upon by the Poard in determining that the sharter school failed to remedy a

(1) All evidence relied upon by the Board in determining that the charter school failed to remedy a violation.

(2) The date and time at which the Board will it shall hold a public hearing concerning the revocation, on the date specified in the notice,. Within which shall be held no more than 30 calendar days after the Board issues this notice the public hearing, or within 60 calendar days if extended by written mutual agreement of the Board and the charter school, the Board shall issue a final decision to revoke or decline to revoke the charter. (Education Code 47607; 5 CCR 11968.5.2)

No later than 30 days after providing the Notice of Intent to Revoke, the Board shall hold a public hearing, in the normal course of business, on the issue of whether evidence exists to revoke the charter. No later than 30 days after the public hearing, the Board shall issue a final decision to revoke or decline to revoke the charter, unless the Board and the charter school agree to extend the issuance of the decision by an additional 30 days. The Board shall not revoke a charter unless it makes written factual findings supported by substantial evidence, specific to the charter school, that supports its findings. (Education Code § 47607; 5 CCR § 11968.5.2)

If the Board does not act to issue a final decision within the specified timeframr, fails to meet the timelines specified above for issuing a Notice of Intent to Revoke or a final decision, the revocation process is shall be deemed terminated and the Notice of Intent is void. (5 CCR 11968.5.2)

Within 10 calendar days of <u>issuing</u> the Board's final decision, the Superintendent or designee shall provide a copy of the final decision to the <u>California Department of Education</u> (CDE) and the County Board <u>of Education</u>. (Education Code 47604.32; 5 CCR 11968.5.2)

Severe and Imminent Threat

The procedures specified above shall not be applicable when the Board determines, in writing, that any violation under Education Code 47607 constitutes a severe and imminent threat to the health or safety of students. In such circumstances, the Board may immediately revoke the school's charter by approving and delivering a Notice of Revocation by Determination of a Severe and Imminent Threat to Pupil Health or Safety to the charter school's governing body, the County Board, and the CDE. (Education Code 47607; 5 CCR 11968.5.3)

Appeals

In the event that the lifthe Board revokes the a charter, the charter school may appeal the revocation to the County Board, within 30 days following of the Board's final decision, appeal the revocation to the County Board. Either the charter school or the district may subsequently appeal the County Board's decision to the SBE. The County Board may reverse the revocation decision if it determines that the findings made by the Board are not supported by substantial evidence. The Board may appeal the reversal to the State Board of Education (SBE). If the County Board does not issue a decision on appeal within 90 days' of receipt or if the County Board upholds the revocation, the charter school may appeal the revocation to the SBE (Education Code 47607; 47607.3; 5 CCR 11968.5.3-11968.5.5)

School Closure

If a charter school ceases operation due to revocation, the charter school shall implement the school closure procedures specified in the charter in accordance with Education Code 47605 and 5 CCR 11962.





ITEM DESCRIPTION: Included in the Board binders for discussion is information on the vision for transforming the Special Education Department through shared accountability, increased capacity, operational efficiency, and effectiveness with budget recommendations for the 2023/24 fiscal year. Recommendations for additional student support staff and departmental leaders will not only increase capacity to serve students and meet districtwide goals but also strengthen existing services and operations through shared accountability for staff in ways that focus staff and families on quality instruction, access to core curriculum, interventions, customer service quality, family engagement, and operational efficiency.

In 2018, the Council of Great City Schools conducted a review of the Special Education Services in Fresno Unified School District. That report resulted in recommendations such as quality instruction, operational efficiency, core curriculum access, and engagement for students and families. This presentation will ground us in the work that is ongoing toward achieving the objectives outlined in that report and describe the recommendations that the department is making toward further acceleration toward those goals. The presentation includes shared accountability processes and additional positions to support school sites, students, families, and department staff. The following list includes highlights of the Special Education Department's year-to-date achievements as evidence of organizational success:

- 1. Completed over 430 Individualized Education Plans (IEP) in the past three weeks (only 1100 more to meet the goal of June 30 when every student with a disability will have an IEP in Fresno Unified, which supports closing achievement gaps at challenging levels).
- 2. Hired 20 of the 27 School Psychologists and seven of the 15 additional Regional Instructional Managers approved as part of a \$33 million dollar investment through Local Control Funding Formula funding this year.
- 3. Added Special-Day Class Chemistry courses to align with the Chemistry courses offered for all students.
- 4. Re-launched of the Inclusive Practices partnership with The New Teacher Project and Supporting Inclusive Practices Grant work, and re-establishing dual enrollment for students with extensive support needs at Fresno City College in the Disabled Students Programs Services.
- 5. Organizing departmental protocols to include frequent professional growth opportunities for departmental staff and consistent submissions of timely annual staff evaluations.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: The funding requested for the 2023/24 fiscal year is estimated at nearly \$10,000,000.








Eligibility by Region (2022)







Fresno Unified Board Bylaw (BB) 9000 Role of The Board (Powers And Responsibilities)

The Governing Board is elected by the community to provide leadership and citizen oversight of the district's schools. The Board shall work with the Superintendent to fulfill its major roles, which include:

- 1. Establishing a long-term vision for the district Setting the direction for the district through a process that involves the community, parents/guardians, students, and staff and is focused on student learning and achievement
- 2. Establishing and maintaining a basic organizational structure for the district, including employment of the Superintendent and adoption of policies, curriculum, the budget and the collective bargaining agreement an effective and efficient organizational structure for the district by:
- a. **Employing the Superintendent** and setting policy for hiring of other personnel
- b. Overseeing the development and adoption of policies
- c. Establishing academic expectations and adopting the curriculum and instructional materials
- d. Establishing budget priorities and adopting the budget
- e. Providing safe, adequate facilities that support the district's instructional program
- f. Setting parameters for negotiations with employee organizations and ratifying collective bargaining agreements
- 3. Providing support to the Superintendent and staff as they carry out the Board's direction by:
- a. Establishing and adhering to standards of responsible governance
- b. Making decisions and providing resources that support district priorities and goals
- c. Upholding Board policies
- d. Being knowledgeable about district programs and efforts in order to serve as effective spokespersons
- 4. 3. Ensuring accountability to the public for the performance of the district's schools by local community, including personnel, programmatic and fiscal accountability and service as a judicial and appeals body as needed.
- Evaluating the Superintendent and setting policy for the evaluation of other personnel
- b. Monitoring and evaluating the effectiveness of policies
- c. Serving as a judicial (hearing) and appeals body in accordance with law, Board policies, and negotiated agreements
- d. Monitoring student achievement and program effectiveness and requiring program changes as necessary
- e. Monitoring and adjusting district finances
- f. Monitoring the collective bargaining process
- 5. Providing community leadership and advocacy on behalf of students, the district's educational program, and public education in order to build support at the local, state and national levels on behalf of children, district programs and public education

The Board is authorized to establish and finance any program or activity that is not in conflict with, inconsistent with, or preempted by law. (Education Code 35160)

The Board may delegate any of its duties to the Superintendent or designee but shall be ultimately responsible for the performance of any duties it delegates. (Education Code <u>35161</u>)

Vision

The Board shall set the direction for the district by adopting a vision statement which defines the district's goals and priorities. The Board shall carry out its vision-setting role by identifying the strengths and needs of the district, developing and adopting a process for framing the vision, soliciting staff and community input as appropriate, ensuring that the adopted vision statement is implemented, and conducting a periodic review of the vision.

Superintendent Selection and Evaluation

The Board shall be solely responsible for employing the Superintendent and ensuring that he/she is the best match for the district based on needed abilities, traits and level of knowledge. When selecting a new Superintendent, the Board shall ensure a smooth transition period; evaluate the district's current and long-term needs; plan and conduct a process for recruitment, screening and selection; and approve the Superintendent's employment contract. The Board shall yearly evaluate the Superintendent based on an evaluation system and performance objectives established by the Board and Superintendent.

Policy Adoption and Monitoring

The Board shall govern the schools by adopting policies that reflect the district's vision and the mandates of law. The Board shall establish a clear policy development process through which it may deliberate on issues, identify priorities, assign responsibilities, identify goals and courses of action, and review policy decisions.

The Board shall also adopt bylaws that promote cooperation, trust and teamwork among its members, give parameters to the Board's operation as a governing body, and ensure that its meetings proceed efficiently and in compliance with law.

Curriculum Adoption and Program Accountability

While the design and implementation of curriculum is primarily a staff responsibility, the Board's role is to adopt overall educational goals and

standards, define the curriculum development process, specify graduation requirements, adopt the developed curriculum and ensure compliance with state and federal laws.

To ensure accountability to the community, the Board shall establish measurable benchmarks to assess the effectiveness of the district's educational programs in producing desired student achievement results. Based on these assessments, the Board shall direct the Superintendent or

designee to take corrective actions as needed.

Budget, Facilities and Fiscal Accountability

The Board shall adopt a sound, responsible budget that supports district goals and priorities. To guide the Superintendent or designee in development of the budget, the Board shall establish a budget calendar, budget process and spending priorities.

Recognizing that school facilities are a long term obligation that impacts district budgets, the Board shall also ensure that a plan is in place to address the district's facility needs, including the funding, construction and maintenance of school facilities. The Board shall approve facility sites, funding sources and architectural and construction contracts.

The Board recognizes that it is accountable to the community for its budget and facilities decisions and for the district's fiscal integrity. The Board shall use accountability systems and processes in order to monitor the district's fiscal health.

Community Leadership

Recognizing that the level of local, state and national support for education impacts the Board's ability to fulfill its responsibilities, the Board shall engage in advocacy on behalf of district schools. The Board shall ensure that the district has the capability to respond to emergency issues as well as a proactive communications plan for issues that are district priorities.

The Board shall also build and maintain community support by actively involving parents/guardians, business and other community members in the schools and informing them about district programs, policies and issues.

Management Oversight

The purpose of this policy is to guide the Governing Board with a standard for highly effective and efficient Management Oversight. The Board is a body corporate, not a collection of individuals, governed by the state and federal law to serve the interests of district.

The Board will fulfill its duty to assure the public that district resources are being used efficiently and effectively by reviewing the integrity and performance of the districts major management systems on a regular basis. This policy sets forth standards and describes processes, but from time to time processes and timelines may vary. The standards and processes are not intended to be overly restrictive or become issues of dispute, but rather to provide guidelines for effective management oversight.

Management Oversight

The Board is responsible for overseeing management of the districts major systems to assure all staff and district systems have as their overarching goal, student achievement. Major systems are discussed and listed in the Board policy on Board Workshops and the Board Workshops calendar.

(cf. 9320.1 - Board Workshops)

The Board will hold the Superintendent accountable for the performance of the district systems. The Board will consider the results of its oversight reviews into the Superintendents annual performance evaluation. In exercising its oversight responsibilities, the Board will not manage the day-to-day operations of the district.

The Board will fulfill its management oversight responsibilities by:

Reviewing the performance of all major management systems at least annually, using performance measurements approved by the Board

Reviewing the integrity of all major management systems at least once every three years (where integrity is defined as overall effectiveness, including structure, process, performance measurements, internal controls, etc.)

Overseeing the annual external financial audit process

Ensuring that the Superintendent acts on the auditors recommendations

The Superintendent will be responsible for ensuring that all procedures, controls, checks and balances, and codes of ethics are in place and are being executed properly.

The Board, acting as a body, will require the Superintendent to provide data and other information necessary to document effective execution and results. The Board may also decide to call for external reviews of systems integrity and performance (e.g., from audit firms, task forces comprised of local experts or community members, etc.).

Fresno Unified Board Bylaw (BB) 9012 Board Member Electronic Communications

The Governing Board recognizes that electronic communication is an efficient and convenient way for Board members to communicate and expedite the exchange of information within the district and with members of the public. Board members shall exercise caution so as to ensure that electronic communications are not used as a means for the Board to deliberate outside of an agendized Board meeting, circumvent the public's right to access records regarding district business, or restrict access to a public forum.

A majority of the Board shall not, outside of an authorized meeting, use a series of electronic communications of any kind, directly or through intermediaries, to discuss, deliberate, or take action on any item that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. (Government Code 54952.2)

(cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices)

Examples of permissible electronic communications concerning district business include, but are not limited to, dissemination of Board meeting agendas and agenda packets, reports of activities from the Superintendent, and reminders regarding meeting times, dates, and places.

Board members may engage in separate conversations or communications with members of the public on a social media platform to answer questions, provide information, or solicit information regarding a matter that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, as long as a majority of the Board does not use the platform to discuss among themselves any business of a specific nature that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. A Board member is prohibited from responding directly to any communication from other Board members regarding matters that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board or using digital icons (e.g., "likes" or emojis) to express reactions to communications made by other Board members. (Government Code 54952.2)

Whenever a Board member uses a social media platform to communicate with the public about district business or Board activities, the Board member shall not block access to a member of the public based on the viewpoint expressed by that individual.

Board members may use electronic communications to discuss matters that do not pertain to district business, regardless of the number of Board members participating in the discussion.

Board members shall make every effort to ensure that their electronic communications conform to the same standards and protocols established for other forms of communication. A Board member may respond, as appropriate, to an electronic communication received from a member of the community and should make clear that the response does not necessarily reflect the views of the Board as a whole. Any complaint or request for information should be forwarded to the Superintendent in accordance with Board bylaws and protocols so that the issue may receive proper consideration and be handled through the appropriate district process. As appropriate, communication received from the media shall be forwarded to the designated district spokesperson.

To the extent possible, electronic communications regarding any district-related business shall be transmitted through a district-provided device or account. When any such communication is transmitted through a Board member's personal device or account, the Board member shall copy the communication to a district electronic storage device for easy retrieval.

Fresno Unified Board Bylaw (BB) 9110 Regular and Student Members; Terms of Office

Regular Members

The Governing Board shall consist of seven members whose terms shall be staggered so that as nearly as practicable, one half of the members shall be elected in each year in which the Board's elections are regularly held. (Education Code 35012).

The term of office for Board members elected in regular elections shall be four years, commencing on the second Friday in December following their election. (Education Code 5017) and staggered so that, as nearly as practicable, one-half of the members are elected in each even-numbered year.

The term of office for Board members elected in regular elections shall be four years, commencing on the second Friday in December following their election. (Education Code 5017)

Board members whose terms have expired shall continue to discharge the duties of office until their successors have qualified by taking the oath of office. (Education Code 5017; Government Code 1302, 1360)

If a regularly scheduled Board election date is changed due to consolidation with a statewide or municipal general election, the term of incumbent Board members shall be extended to align with the next applicable election. (Elections Code 10404.5)

(cf. 9220 - Elections) (cf. 9223 - Filling Vacancies)

Student Board Members

The Board believes it is important to seek out and consider students' ideas, viewpoints and reactions to the educational program. In order to facilitate student input and involvement, student Board member(s) are encouraged to attend all Board meetings except closed sessions.

Procedures for the selection and appointment of student Board members shall be approved by the Board. The term of student Board members shall be one calendar year, commencing on July 1. (Education Code 35012)

Student Board members shall be seated with regular Board members and be recognized at meetings as full members. They may participate in questioning witnesses and discussing issues and shall receive all materials presented to Board members except those related to closed sessions.

Student Board members may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in meeting responsibilities of the position, but shall not receive the compensation for attendance at Board meetings to which regular Board members may be entitled. (Education Code 35012)

(cf. 9250 - Remuneration, Reimbursement, Other Benefits)

Student Board members may exercise a preferential vote on agenda items with the exception of items involving personnel or items which have been a subject of closed session deliberation. The preferential vote is advisory and will in no case determine the outcome of the agenda item. The vote shall be recorded in the Board meeting minutes.

Fresno Unified Board Bylaw (BB) 9220 Governing Board Elections

Board Member Qualifications

Any person is eligible to be a member of the Governing Board, without further qualifications, if the person he/she is 18 years of age or older, a citizen of the state California, a resident of the school district, a registered voter, and not legally disqualified from holding civil office, and resides in designated trustee areas. Any person who has been convicted of a felony involving the giving, accepting, or offering of a bribe, embezzlement or theft of public funds, extortion, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any such crime, under California law or the law of another state, the United States of America, or another country, is not eligible to be a candidate for office or elected as be a Board member except when the person he/she has been granted a pardon in accordance with law. (Education Code 35107; Elections Code 20)

A district employee elected to the Board shall resign from district employment his/her position before being sworn in or shall have the his/her employment automatically terminated upon being sworn into office. (Education Code 35107)

(cf. 9224 – Oath of Affirmation) (cf. 9270 – Conflict of Interest)

The Board encourages all candidates to become knowledgeable about the role of board members. The Superintendent or designee shall provide all candidates with information that will enable them to understand the responsibilities and expectations of being a Board member, including information regarding available workshops, seminars, and/or training. The Superintendent or designee shall provide all candidates with the county election official's contact information and general information about school programs, district operations, and Board responsibilities.

(cf. 9230 - Orientation) (cf. 9240 - Board Training)

Recalling a Board Member

A Board member may be recalled as permitted by Elections Code 11000. Proponents of a recall are required to serve, file, and publish or post a notice of intention to circulate the recall petition and to comply with other applicable law and formalities and county elections official directives. The petition, pursuant to Elections Code 11041, is required to be in the format provided by the Secretary of State and to include an estimate of the cost of conducting the special election, as determined by the county elections official, in consultation with the district.

Within 14 days after the meeting at which the Board receives a certificate of sufficiency of signatures on a recall petition from the county elections official, the Board shall order an election to be held to determine whether the Board member named in the petition shall be recalled. The election shall be held not less than 88, nor more than 125, days after the date that the Board orders the election. However, the election may be conducted within 180 days after the issuance of the Board's order to consolidate the election with a regularly scheduled election.

Recall elections shall be conducted in accordance with Elections Code 11381-11386.

Consolidation of Elections

To reduce costs associated with conducting elections, the Board may consolidate Board elections with the local municipal or statewide primary or general election. Board election procedures shall be conducted in accordance with Elections Code 1302. State and federal law. (cf. 9110 - Terms of Office)

In addition, if a regularly scheduled Board election held other than on a statewide election date results in a decrease in local voter turnout of 25 percent or more compared to the average local turnout for the previous four statewide general elections, the Board shall take action to consolidate Board elections with statewide elections. (Elections Code 14051, 14052)

In order to consolidate elections based on either circumstance described above, the Board shall adopt a resolution and submit it to the County Board of Supervisors for approval not later than 240 days prior to the date of the currently scheduled district election. (Elections Code 10404.5)

Whenever a regularly scheduled Board election is changed due to consolidation of elections, the terms of office of incumbent Board members shall be extended to align with the next applicable election. (Elections Code 10404.5)

(cf. 9110 - Terms of Office)

Elections Process and Procedures Electing Board Members

The district is divided into trustee areas and each trustee area shall be represented by a Board member who resides in and is elected by voters residing within that trustee area. Trustee area shall be balanced by population as required by state and federal law.

Prior to March 1 following the year in which the results of each decennial federal census are released, the Board shall adjust the boundaries of the district's trustee areas based on population figures as validated by the Population Research Unit of the Department of Finance. (Education Code 5019.5)

The election method or trustee-area boundaries in effect at the beginning of a Board member's term shall be used when any vacancy that occurs during that term is to be filled, even if, during the term, the district has adopted "by-trustee area" election method or trustee area boundaries have been adjusted.

Any petition for a special election ordered pursuant to Education Code 5091 shall contain the county election official's estimate of the cost of conducting the special election, expressed on a per-student basis. (Education Code 5091)

Campaign Conduct

All candidates, including current Board members running as incumbents, shall abide by local, county, state, and federal requirements regarding campaign donations, funding, and expenditures.

A Board member shall not expend, and a candidate shall not accept, any public money for the purpose of seeking elective office. However, the district may establish a dedicated fund for those seeking election to the Board, provided that the funds are available to all candidates who are qualified pursuant to Education Code 35107 without regard to incumbency or political preference. (Government Code 85300)

In order to help protect the public's trust in the electoral process as well as the public's confidence in the Board and district, the Board encourages all candidates to sign and adhere to the principles in the Code of Fair Campaign Practices pursuant to Elections Code 20440.

(cf. 0410 – Nondiscrimination in District Programs and Activities) (cf. 9005 – Governance Standards)

Statement of Qualifications

The district shall assume no part of the cost of printing, handling, translating, mailing, or electronically distributing candidate statements filed pursuant to Elections Code 13307. As a condition of having candidate statements included in the hard copy and/or electronic voter's pamphlet, the district may require candidates to pay their estimated pro rata share of these costs to the district in advance pursuant to Elections Code 13307.

The district shall assume no part of the cost of printing, handling, translating, or electronically distributing candidate statements filed pursuant to Elections Code 13307. As a condition of having candidate statements included in the hard copy and/or electronic voter's pamphlet, the district may require candidates to pay their estimated pro rata share of these costs to the district in advance pursuant to Elections Code 13307.

On the 125th day prior to the day fixed for the general district election, the Board secretary or his/her designee shall deliver a notice, bearing the secretary's signature and district seal, to the county elections official describing both of the following: (Elections Code 10509)

- 1. The elective offices of the district to be filled at the general election and which offices, if any, are for the balance of an unexpired term
- 4. 2. Whether the district or the candidate is to pay for the publication of a statement of qualifications pursuant to Elections Code 13307

(cf. 9223 – Filling Vacancies)

Tie Votes in Board Member Elections

Whenever a tie makes it impossible to determine which of two or more candidates has been elected to the Board, the Board shall immediately notify the candidates who received the tie votes of the time and place where the candidates or their representatives should appear before the Board. The Board at that time shall determine the winner by lot (i.e. by a coin toss, random drawing). (Education Code 5016)

Fresno Unified School District Board Bylaw (BB) 9223 Filling Vacancies

Events Causing a Vacancy

A vacancy on the Governing Board may occur for any of the following events:

- 1. The death of an incumbent. (Government Code 1770)
- 2. The adjudication pursuant to a quo warranto proceeding declaring that an incumbent is physically or mentally incapacitated due to disease, illness, or accident and that there is reasonable cause to believe that the incumbent will not be able to perform the duties of their office for the remainder of their term. (Government Code 1770)
- 3. A Board members resignation. (Government Code 1770)

A vacancy resulting from resignation occurs when the written resignation is filed with the County Superintendent of Schools having jurisdiction over the district, except where a deferred effective date is specified in the resignation so filed, in which case the resignation shall become operative on that date. A Board member may not defer the effective date of their resignation for more than 60 days after they file the resignation with the County Superintendent. Upon being filed with the County Superintendent, a written resignation, whether specifying a deferred effective date or otherwise, shall be irrevocable. (Education Code 5090, 5091)

A Board member may not defer the effective date of their resignation for more than 60 days after they file the resignation with the County Superintendent.

- 4. A Board members removal from office, including recall. (Government Code 1770; Elections Code 11384)
- 5. A Board members ceasing to be a resident of the district. (Government Code 1770)

A vacancy on the Board also occurs when a Board member ceases to inhabit the trustee area which they represent on the Board. (58 Ops.Cal.Atty.Gen. 888 (1975))

- 6. Board member's absence from the state for more than 60 days, except in the following situations: (Government Code 1064, 1770)
- a. Upon district business with the approval of the Board
- b. With the consent of the Board for an additional period not to exceed a total absence of 90 days

In the case of illness or other urgent necessity involving the Board member, or the Board member's spouse, child or parent, as defined by Family Medical Leave Act, and upon a proper showing thereof, the time limited for absence from the state may be extended by the Board.

c. For federal military deployment, not to exceed an absence of a total of six months, as a member of the armed forces of the United States or the California National Guard

If the absence of the Board member for this purpose exceeds six months, the Board may approve an additional six-month absence upon a showing that there is a reasonable expectation that the member will return within the second six-month period, and the Board may appoint an interim member to serve in their absence. If two or more members of the Board are absent by reason of these circumstances, and

those absences result in the inability to establish a quorum at a regular meeting, the Board may immediately appoint one or more interim members, as necessary to enable the Board to conduct business and discharge its responsibilities.

The term of an interim member appointed in these circumstances shall not extend beyond the return of the absent Board member or beyond the next regularly scheduled election for that office, whichever occurs first.

- 7. A Board member's ceasing to discharge the duties of their office for the period of three consecutive months, except when prevented by illness, involving the Board member, or the Board member's spouse, child or parent, as defined by the Family Medical Leave Act, or when absent from the state with the permission required by law. (Government Code 1770)
- 8. A Board member's conviction of a felony or any offense involving a violation of their official duties or conviction of a designated crime resulting in a forfeiture of office (Government Code1770, 3000-3003)
- 9. A Board member's refusal or neglect to file their required oath within the time prescribed. (Government Code 1770)

(cf. 9224 - Oath or Affirmation)

- 10. The decision of a competent tribunal declaring void a Board member's election or appointment. (Government Code 1770)
- 11. A Board member's commitment to a hospital or sanitarium as a drug addict, dipsomaniac, inebriate, or stimulant addict by a court of competent jurisdiction, in which case the office shall not be deemed vacant until the order of commitment has become final (Government Code 1770)
- 12. A "failure to elect" in which no candidate or an insufficient number of candidates have filed to run for a Board seat(s) (Education Code 5090, 5326, 5328)

Timelines for Filling a Vacancy

When a vacancy occurs, the Board shall take the following action, as appropriate:

- 1. When a vacancy occurs within four months of the end of a Board member's term, the Board shall take no action. (Education Code 5093)
- 2. When a vacancy occurs longer than four months before the end of a Board member's term, the Board shall, within 60 days of the date of the vacancy or the filing of the member's deferred resignation, either order an election or make a provisional appointment, unless a special election is mandated as described in item #3 below. (Education Code 5091)
- 3. When a vacancy occurs from six months to 130 days before a regularly scheduled Board election at which the position is not scheduled to be filled, a special election to fill the position shall be consolidated with the regular election. The person so elected shall take office at the first regularly scheduled Board meeting following the certification of the election and shall serve only until the end of the term of the position which the person their was elected to fill. (Education Code 5093)

4. When a vacancy occurs outside of the statutory time windows identified in Items #1 and #2 above, the Board shall, within 60 days of the date of the vacancy or the filing of the member's deferred resignation, either order an election or make a provisional appointment. (Education Code 5091, 5093)

Eligibility

In order to be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy on the Board, a person must meet the eligibility requirements specified in Education Code 35107, as described in BB 9220 - Governing Board Elections.

(cf. 9220 - Governing Board Elections)

Provisional Appointments

When authorized by law to make a provisional appointment to fill a vacancy on the Board, the Board shall advertise in the local media to solicit candidate applications or nominations. A committee consisting of less than a quorum of the Board shall ensure that applicants are eligible for Board membership and announce the names of the eligible candidates. The Board shall interview the candidates at a public meeting, accept oral or written public input, and select the provisional appointee by a majority vote.

(cf. 9130 - Board Committees) (cf. 9323.2 - Actions by the Board)

Within 10 days after the appointment is made, the Board shall post notices of the actual vacancy, or the filing of a deferred resignation, and the provisional appointment. The notice shall be published in the local newspaper pursuant to Government Code 6061 and posted in at least three public places within the district. (Education Code 5092)

The notice shall contain: (Education Code 5092)

- 1. The date of the occurrence of the vacancy or the date of the filing of, and the effective date of, the resignation
- 2. The full name of the appointee
- 3. The date of appointment
- 4. A statement notifying the voters that unless a petition calling for a special election pursuant to Education Code 5091 is filed in the office of the County Superintendent of Schools within 30 days of the provisional appointment, it shall become an effective appointment

The person appointed shall hold office until the next regularly scheduled election for district Board members and shall be afforded all the powers and duties of a Board member upon appointment. (Education Code 5091)

If within 30 days of the Board's appointment, registered voters of the district or, where elections are by trustee areas, of the trustee area submit a petition for special election which the County Superintendent determines to be legally sufficient, the provisional appointment is terminated, and a special election shall be held in accordance with Education Code 5091 to fill the vacancy.

Appointment Due to Failure to Elect

When a vacancy occurs because no candidate or an insufficient number of candidates have been nominated (i.e., a failure to elect) and a district election will not be held, the Board shall appoint a qualified person to the office. This appointment shall be made at a meeting prior to the day fixed for the election and the appointee shall be seated at the organizational meeting as if elected at the district

election. (Education Code 5328)

(cf. 9100 - Organization)

When an appointment is being made because of a failure to elect, the district shall publish a notice once in a newspaper of general circulation published in the district, or if no such newspaper exists, in a newspaper having general circulation within the district. This notice shall state that the Board intends to make an appointment and shall inform persons of the procedure available for applying for the appointment. (Education Code 5328.5)

The procedure for selecting and interviewing candidates shall be the same as the procedures for "Provisional Appointments," as specified above.

Policy Manual

The Governing Board recognizes the importance of adopting policies that reflect the district's vision and maintaining a policy manual that is up-to-date and reflects the mandates of law.

(cf. 9000 - Role of the Board)

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a district policy manual for the purpose of communicating to all interested stakeholders the policies, regulations and bylaws within which district schools will operate. The Board encourages members of the public to acquaint themselves with the district's policy manual.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the community and all district employees have access to the policy manual. A public copy of the manual shall be maintained in the district central office and at each school site. These copies shall be maintained either electronically or by paper copy.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures for distributing to all authorized policy manual holders copies of new or revised policies, bylaws and regulations as they are adopted. Annually, the Superintendent or designee shall review the paper and/or electronic copies of the district's policy manual to ensure that they are up-to-date and complete.

Board Policies

The office of the Superintendent or designee will receive sample policies, regulations and bylaws issued by the California School Boards Association. The following procedures will be followed:

1. The Superintendent or designee will review the samples.

2. Policies, regulations and bylaws mandated by law will be given top priority. The Superintendent or designee will ensure that those mandated by law by a certain date are reviewed,

amended if necessary and adopted by the Governing Board within the timeline prescribed by law.

3. Policies will be reviewed for:

a. Legal requirements.

b. Applicability at the local level.

c. Options legally available to the district.

d. Future need.

4. The Superintendent or designee may delegate the initial task of review and revision to the administrator with appropriate expertise. However, the Superintendent or designee shall retain the

responsibility of final review before submitting policies to the Board.

5. Draft policies, regulations and bylaws may be submitted to the district's legal counsel and/or

Cabinet for review and recommendations.

6. The Superintendent or designee's office shall place the draft policy or bylaw statement on the agenda of a public Board meeting for first reading. Administrative regulations will be placed on

the Cabinet agenda for approval.

7. The Board may return the drafts to the Superintendent or designee for further revision and/or

move to give them a second reading and adoption.

The Governing Board shall adopt Board bylaws to govern the internal operations of the Board.

Administrative Regulations

In accordance with Governing Board policy, the Superintendent or designee shall specify required actions and design detailed arrangements under which the schools will be operated. The Superintendent or designee shall develop administrative regulations when required by law or Board policy or when, in his/her judgment, Board endorsement of district procedures is desired. Administrative regulations approved by the Board shall be included in the district's policy manual. District and site level procedures will be maintained in appropriate district and/or site locations.

Administrative regulations shall be consistent with Board policies, the California Education code, education-related laws, negotiated employee contracts, and rules and regulations of the State Board of Education. The Board may direct the revision of any regulations which it finds inconsistent with Board policy. Administrative regulations may be approved at a first reading by the Board.

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Suspension of Policies, Bylaws, Administrative Regulations

Policies, bylaws and administrative regulations may be suspended for a specific purpose and limited time by majority vote.

Suspension of any policy, bylaw or administrative regulation shall undergo the following consideration:

- 1. Policies, bylaws or administrative regulations shall be reviewed on their own merits rather than the circumstances of the moment.
- 2. The Governing Board shall decide whether the policy, bylaw or administrative regulation still reflects the intent of the Board and the law. If so, the suspension will be denied and the policy, bylaw or administrative regulation reaffirmed in the minutes.

Superintendent or Designee's Authority

The Superintendent or designee may suspend all or part of any policy, bylaw or administrative regulation when it conflicts with state or federal law or regulations. The Superintendent or designee shall report the suspension to the Board. Suspension shall be valid until the policy, bylaw or administrative regulation is rescinded, amended or reaffirmed.
