Due to receiving more Fresno Unified Scholarship applications than originally expected, the College Career Readiness department requests an additional \$3,850 to have Kaleidoscope provide additional services. The applications received from graduating high school senior students from various Fresno Unified school sites exceeded the anticipated 600 applications originally expected and a total of 853 applications have been received. The additional \$3,850 ensures all applications are equitably reviewed as part of the scholarship process. This addition will bring the total agreement cost to \$31,000. This project will improve the multipurpose building heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) performance by replacing existing evaporative coolers with HVAC package units and upgrading the energy management system controls. Additionally, the project includes an upgrade of the main electrical switch gear to mitigate power disruptions. Staff recommend award to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder: New England Sheet Metal and Mechanical Co. (Fresno, California) \$989,100. The Superintendent recommends approval.
